ENTRY PROCEDURE

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY:

All competitors will be required to submit a <u>non-refundable deposit</u> (stall and office fee) at time of entry via <u>ShowGroundsLive</u>. A credit card number is required to cover your deposit. **No exceptions.**

All entries must be completed on showgroundslive.com by the closing date for the show listed in the prize list. If you have not used this program before, go to https://showgroundslive.com/registration/ and create an account. Then find the page for Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association from the show management company drop down menu on the main page and enter online.

Membership numbers for EC, MHC and Horse Recording (Silver and Gold shows only) will be required upon entry. Please update your SGL profile to include all of your membership numbers. Waivers should also be signed on SGL. Horse health documents should be submitted to the entry secretary upon entry at mhjaentries@gmail.com. Entries will not be considered complete until all your horse's health documents have been received.

Once you have entered you will be able to review your invoice and close out your account at the end of the show. You'll also be able to add/scratch your classes for the following day's competitions until 6:00pm each competition day.

Failure to close out your account by 8pm of the last show day will result in a \$50 charge to the competitor account. Accounts in arrears past this may be subject to further late penalties. Those with unpaid accounts will not be permitted to enter any shows until the account is paid in full and will be placed on a "credit hold" on ShowGroundsLive. The hold will not be removed until such time as the balance is paid.

Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in the preparation of their entry forms. Juniors must have a parent or guardian sign their entry form/waiver.



EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All persons are committed to:

Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;

Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;

Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;

Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;

Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and

Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

 The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

 Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

 Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

 Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

Neither the Red River Exhibition Association, Manitoba Horse Council, the Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association, the Organizing Committee, nor any of its members, staff or agents shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen, from any cause or circumstance whatsoever, to exhibitors, competitors or members or their agents or to any one on the exhibition ground or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on the show grounds or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the show or any journey to or from the show. It is to be understood and agreed that under no circumstances shall the Red River Exhibition Association, Manitoba Horse Council, the Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association, its members, agents, or employees be liable for any loss, damages, claims, or costs occasioned or suffered by an exhibitor, competitor, member or their agents, directly or indirectly, howsoever arising, including without limitation, losses, damages, costs, or claims as a result of the Red River Exhibition Association, Manitoba Horse Council, the Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association, its members, agents or employees' negligence, and you agree to indemnify and save harmless the Red River Exhibition Association, Manitoba Horse Council, the Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association, its members, agents and employees from and against any and all liability arising out of any such loss, damages, claims or costs.



MHJA RULES AND REGULATIONS 2025

MEMBERSHIPS

For insurance purposes, all riders and owners must have a current Manitoba Horse Council (MHC) membership or membership with their own provincial/territorial sport organization (PTSO) if out of province.

In order to compete, the following memberships are required at each show:

Victoria Day -Prairie Crocus (Provincial – MHJA Heritage or full MHJA membership & MHC

Summer Smiles - EC Bronze - MHJA, MHC, Bronze or above EC Sport License

Beach Party - EC Silver - MHJA, MHC, Silver or above Sport License, Horse Recording

Heart of the Continent - EC Gold - MHJA, MHC, Gold or above Sport License, Horse Recording

Summer out of the City - Prairie Crocus (Provincial) – MHJA Heritage/full MHJA & MHC

Fall Harvest - EC Bronze - MHJA, MHC, Bronze or above EC Sport License

Jump into Fall - Prairie Crocus (Provincial) - MHJA Heritage or full MHJA membership & MHC

AMATEUR STATUS

Proof of Amateur Status: see Article A902.

Proof of Amateur Status is required by Competitors in the following classes:

 Adult Amateur Hunter, Junior/Amateur ("Jr/Am") and all other Amateur classes as noted in the prize list. Please ensure when renewing you EC sport license that you have declared yourself as an amateur if applicable. Please se Article G108 for full details on restrictions for amateur status.

SAFE SPORT

See Rule of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Effective 2022, EC Sport License Holders must complete safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion.

HORSE RECORDINGS (Gold and Silver shows ONLY)

**New for 2025: All entries competing at the Silver or Gold level must have a valid Equestrian Canada horse recording in order to compete. (See rules of Equestrian Canada, A602.4). Temporary Horse Recordings will no longer be available

Foreign owned horses are not required to have an EC Horse Recording for show entry but are required to complete a *Foreign Exhibitors Affidavit of Eligibility* at the Show Office.

USEF members may compete on the reciprocity agreement, but proof of USEF membership and horse registrations must be provided to the show office BEFORE the start of the show.

EXEMPTIONS to the horse recording rule (A404) are as follows: A Horse Recording is not required for horses:

- Competing only in the hack division.
- Competing only in Leadline Classes.
- · Competing only in bronze level classes.

COACH/TRAINER INFORMATION

Manitoba Horse Council collects a \$5 levy from all Manitoba entries without named coaches possessing NCCP numbers. Manitoba coaches should know that it is easy to obtain the NCCP number through any online programs, such as the Minimum Coaching Standard Module of Making Ethical Decisions, give a pathway to obtain the NCCP number.

Questions regarding how to obtain the NCCP number should be directed to the MHC office, coaching committee, nccp.ca or Sport Manitoba.

Canadian Coaches at EC sanctioned events must hold a minimum Licensed EC Coach Status. Please see EC Prize List insert for more information or https://www.equestrian.ca/programs-services/coaches/coach-status-program. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form, or specify that they are self-coached. See Rule of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 103, Coach Status.

PERSON RESPONSIBLE

All entry forms completed must be signed by a PERSON RESPONSIBLE (PR) for the horse and rider. Anyone signing the entry form as the Person Responsible must be an EC Sport Licence holder in good standing OR in the case of junior/minor owner entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR. The PR's level of sport license must be the same as the applicable show.

NOMINATION & START FEES

Any competitor may nominate any horse by name for any competition or division by paying the entry or nomination fees. NOMINATION FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE. The horse and/or rider can compete as per the regulations set out in each section. Please note: the program automatically enters you in the class when the nomination fee is entered. Please notify the show office prior to 5:00pm the day before the class is held if you are not starting.

Horses not nominated in sections requiring nomination may do so after the start of the show by paying double the nomination fee.

CHANGE OF ENTRIES

All adds and scratches must be made before 6pm the night before on Showgrounds live. Jumpers may enter by class, but a \$5 fee will be charged if the changes are not made by the night before. Same-day entry of any of the Hunte Divisions or Equitation Classes, including Hunter Schooling Classes, will result in a \$5 fee.

CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES

Regardless of reason, the deposit (stall and office fee) is non-refundable after the closing date. The stall for the cancelled entry will revert to the show for re-assignment.

If a class does not fill and is cancelled, the show secretary shall notify the exhibitors at earliest possible opportunity. No class will be cancelled if it has 5 or more entries. A competition may, at its discretion, hold a class with fewer than 4 entries.

<u>Note:</u> Competitors are asked to advise the show office and in-gates immediately when they are scratching from an event, and/or from the remainder of the competition.

Substitution of horses is permitted if the show secretary is notified <u>prior</u> to the start of the show. If a substitution is made after the start of the show, a \$25.00 fee will apply.

SITE DEVELOPMENT FEE (MHC Equestrian Centre)

There is a site development fee of \$5 per horse that goes towards maintaining and upgrading the facility.

MEDICATION CONTROL (DRUG TESTING)

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in an EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)

DRUG FEES

All horses are assessed a horse/pony drug fee and are subject to drug testing. Any horse entered in any class at a competition is required to pay drug testing fees while on the competition grounds, and on the recommendation of the Chair of the Provincial Equine Medication Control committee or the Chair's appointee, may be selected for equine medication control testing (see EC Rule Article A 1006). All owners agree that by making their entry, they will allow their horses to be tested. A fee of \$4.00/horse will be submitted at Bronze competitions and \$8.00/horse at the Silver and Gold competitions.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

SHOW OFFICE

The Show Office will open at approximately 12:00 pm on arrival day and approximately one hour before classes start each day, and closes at 5:00 pm unless otherwise posted. Adds/scratches for the next day can be done on ShowGroundsLive until 6pm

BACK NUMBERS

*** New for 2025: Competitors are required to wear the back number assigned to them. Every entry will be assigned an identification number by the competition organizing committee. You will be required to check into the office the first day of the show and provide your Credit Card authorization number in order to receive your show number. To make the process faster, competitors are also asked to have their membership numbers on hand so memberships can be verified. Should the competitor have an outstanding balance, they will not receive the show number, and will not be permitted to compete. Any outstanding balance must be paid in full prior to the competitor receiving their number and being allowed to compete.

Numbers must be worn and visible <u>at all times</u> in the barn, schooling, exercise and practice areas as well as in the competition rings. (FEI 1.1.2). Please put numbers on before entering the warm up areas. Each horse uses the same number each time it enters the ring at that show, including Equitation Classes.

STABLING

Priority for stabling will be given to horses entered for the entire show. Please name the barn/coach with whom you wish to be stabled. Management will try to honor all written requests for stabling together. An emergency contact & phone number MUST be displayed on stall doors. Stalls must be thoroughly cleaned and sufficiently bedded daily by 10:00 am every day. All refuse must be placed in designated areas. Aisles must be kept clean. Individual competitors will be responsible for any extra cost resulting from excessive damage to stalls and any damage must be reported to the Show Office. Excessive amounts of shavings left in the stall at the end of the show will result in additional clean out charges.

TACK STALLS

Priority will be given to large groups if space becomes limited.

UNSTABLED HORSES/DAILY SHIP-INS (MHC Equestrian Centre)

As per MHC policy, all unstabled horses are subject to a Grounds Fee of \$10 per day.

HORSES TIED TO TRAILERS OR STANDING IN TRAILERS MUST ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:

Horses must be supervised at all times and cannot be left unattended. Food and water must be available at all times. Any concerns on the part of the Competition Organizers and/or Officials must be addressed immediately. The location for tying will be determined by the Equestrian Centre Manager and may change according to demand. Adequate hay and water must be provided and clean-up of the area must occur. The trailer in which the horse is tied to or standing on must be attached to a truck. During inclement weather, horses need to be provided shelter in a temporary stall (BHP) or an empty stall (RREX) while the weather passes. If no stalls are available, the horse(s) will need to be transported home.

VET AND FARRIER

A Farrier and Vet will be available on an on-call basis. Their Name and Contact Information will be posted in the show office.

FIRST AID

Medics will be in attendance during schooling and competition hours and warm-up day. No jumping will be permitted until the medic is present. Please call 911 in case of emergency at other times if needed.

ARRIVAL

Horses will be allowed on the showgrounds the morning of, but not prior to, the first day of warm-ups without prior authorization. The competition rules are in effect upon arrival of the first horse on the competition grounds. All entries will have stalls assigned prior to arrival. Please check the posted list or for stall assignment. Riding is at your own risk and on the flat only until the Steward and medics are present.

SCHOOLING/WARM-UP ROUNDS

All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. Refer to FEI Rules, Article 201 *Exercise and Schooling Areas and Practice Obstacles*. These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation and jumper classes and divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions.

There is a Schooling Fee for all Hunters & Jumpers entering each show. Both rings may be used by any competitor. The number of horses in the schooling rings is limited to 6. Sign-up blocks will be available on ShowGroundsLive the day prior starting at 4pm and ending at 10pm. If you do not sign-up the day prior, you must fit into the open slots available. Please be courteous of others and do not go over your allotted time in the ring.

PRACTICE AREAS & SCHOOLING

Times, rules and locations for lunging and schooling will be posted. Schooling will only be permitted in designated areas, at designated times. All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. There will be no schooling of any kind if the Steward is not in attendance at the show. These rules pertain to all Hunter, Equitation and Jumper classes and Divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions.

LUNGING

Lunging is only permitted in the warm-up ring, lunging ring (BHP) or designated area (RRX – grass area on the North side of the stabling area). No lunging in the warm-up ring when there are other competitors riding their horses. Competitors riding a horse will have the right to enter the warm-up ring and the horses that are being lunged need to leave the warm-up area immediately, no exceptions will be made.

PARKING

Designated parking areas for cars, trailers, vans and campers will be enforced. Horse trailers may not be parked in the barn area during the horse show except for immediate loading/unloading. Competitors, Family and Associates must be parked in the designated parking areas. There will be no parking in the barn areas except for people with mobility issues and valid handicap passes. Please see facility maps for designated parking areas.

PETS

<u>Dogs cannot be loose and must be properly leashed at all times on the show grounds.</u> **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Dogs are not permitted in the warm up ring or in-gate area or in the food tent area. The Show will fine owners \$50 per incident, per dog, for dogs not on leashes. For biosecurity reasons, dogs are not permitted in horse stalls.

EQUINE BIOSECURITY AND EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact. Please observe the following biosecurity protocols:

Limit horse-to-horse contact

- 1. Limit contact between horses and other horses, humans, and other animals.
- Restrict unnecessary movement of horses out of their aisle or barn. Do not take a horse to another barn to be tacked up, braided, clipped, etc. Sharing equipment and grooming supplies, or coming into contact with other horses or soiled surfaces can spread germs.
- 3. Do not lead horses down other tent/barn aisles.
- 4. Do not let horses make nose-to-nose contact with horses from other barns when in common areas such as wash racks, at the rings, or while grazing.
- 5. Do not touch, pet, or feed treats to horses from other barns.

Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spread them via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.

Do not let water hoses touch buckets when filling. Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.

Do not allow horses to drink from the hose. Do not share water or feed buckets.

Use clean brushes and towels on each horse. If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to wash them often.

Do not share tack and equipment, especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.

Monitor your horses temperature and contact the Show Veterinarian if you notice any unusual symptoms.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Coggins: All horses being brought onto the grounds for any competition must have a current NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST valid within 12 months. Horses will be prohibited from entering the grounds in the absence of a valid coggins test being submitted to the show secretary.

Proof of Vaccination: You must provide proof of vaccination for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not. A letter from Veterinarian or invoice from veterinarian is satisfactory and should be submitted to show secretary at time of entry. Proof of vaccination must be e-mailed to show secretary at mhjaentries@ gmail.com. Required Vaccines are: Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months +/- a 21-day grace period. A temperature check should also be done 3 days before the first day of the show. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations

Keep copies of your Vaccination records in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by show organizers to present your health papers at any time.

Ship-Ins/Daily Haul-Ins: If you ship in and out daily, keep copies of your Vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You will be asked to present these records.

West Nile: It is highly recommended that horses are vaccinated for West Nile Virus.

HUMAN BIOSECURITY GUIDELINES

All competitors, owners, coaches, volunteers and show personnel are responsible for following Manitoba Health guidelines when on the showgrounds. All attendees to any MHJA show must familiarize themselves with these procedures to help protect their own health, as well as the health of others in our community. All participants should be mindful to frequently wash their hands or use hand sanitizer.

STALLIONS

Junior B and C exhibitors may not ride, drive, show on the line or handle stallions on the grounds. Junior A exhibitors may ride manageable stallions in Jumper classes ONLY. Art G105

SHOW RULES & ETIQUETTE

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to refuse, limit, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries; disqualify any riders or exhibitors thereby cancelling awarded prizes; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to change rings and/or officials, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors and to intercept all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, any incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Posted notice will be given to all exhibitors in the event of a change in the program.

The abuse or inhumane treatment of horses and/or humans will not be tolerated. Any unsportsmanlike conduct or use of abusive language by any person towards any other person will not be tolerated.

Contemptuous comments and interference towards officials will not be tolerated. No person, other than officials, the Show Committee or Show Management may enter the show ring without the permission of Show Management. Any of the above actions might result in removal from show, forfeiture of prizes and possible exclusion from exhibiting for one or more years.

As per article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition..." (A602.7) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2)

In the interest of the welfare of the horse, competitors may be asked to limit the number of classes for horses that are shown excessively. At Victoria Day, Summer out of the City and Jump into Fall, each horse is limited to four (4) over fences classes per day.

RINGSIDE BEHAVIOUR

It is inappropriate to shout instructions to or critique a rider as they are focusing on their course. Providing some guidance in a normal speaking voice when the rider is near the ingate is acceptable however shouting instructions in a loud manner while the rider is in the ring is very distracting to everyone in the vicinity (including the judge) and may penalize performance. Please be considerate to everyone at the show and limit ringside coaching to appropriate levels.

CONCUSSION PROTOCOLS AND RETURN TO PLAY POLICY

All MHJA competitions will adhere to Sport Manitoba/Equestrian Canada 'Return to Play' guidelines when assessing a rider's ability to continue in the competition following a possible head injury. The guidelines and descriptions of concussive head injuries can be found at www.parachutecanada.org and will be posted in the show office at each competition. In conjunction with the onsite medics, the Show Committee will have discretion as to whether a rider will be allowed to continue in the competition following a suspected concussive head injury and will be made solely to prevent any further injury or long-term harm to that rider.

HORS CONCOURS

Entries will not be accepted in the hunter ring at EC sanctioned shows; Hors Concours rounds may be allowed in the jumper ring at twice the class fee, dependent on entries, at the discretion of the show committee. Horses showing Hors Concours may not compete in that ring again that day over fences.

PRIZES

Prize winners must take part in the prize giving ceremony and should do so with the placed horses. If a prize winner fails, without plausible excuse, to take part at the prize giving ceremony, the organizing committee, at its discretion, may decide to withhold the prize (FEI Art. 248.5). Per EC rules, all prize money will be applied against entry fees to the owner on the entry form or will be mailed within four weeks of the competition. Competitors must ensure that the correct address is included on the entry form or prize money will not be mailed out. Prize cheques must be cashed within three months or prize money will be forfeited. Classes with 4 or more entries will run with prize money as listed in the prize list. Classes with fewer than 4 entries will be run at the discretion of the Show Committee and entry fee and prize money may be modified. If only one horse, they may go and if not eliminated their points will count.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

All Hunter, Hack and Jumper divisions with three (3) or more classes may receive Champion and Reserve. Equitation divisions and some Hunter/Jumper divisions will receive High Point awards. Unless otherwise informed, all horses/ponies must be presented in a bridle for their respective award. Championships will usually be presented after the final class in the Division. Failure to present horses may result in forfeiture of prize money. If there is a tie for Championship in the Hunter Divisions, the horse with the most points over fences will break the tie. In Jumper divisions, a coin toss will break the tie. Equitation ties will hack off. Hack ties will be shown in hand and judged on Conformation. Points for division champion will be awarded for all classes listed in the prize list as part of the division.

TACK AND EQUIPMENT - Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section G, Annex I

Draw reins must be used in a safe manner. Draw reins are permitted in the schooling area. Draw reins are permitted over fences if used in the following manner:

- a) Attached to the girth, running through the front legs and secured at the neck.
- b) Attached to the breastplate.
- c) Attached to the girth at the billet straps; or
- d) Attached to the d-rings at the front of the saddle.

Standing martingales, german martingales and draw reins secured as above will be permitted in jumper classes where the height of the fences does not exceed 1.15m. Junior, amateur or non-pro riders may not compete in draw reins or German martingales.

Restrictive devices such as the de Gogue, chambon, running reins etc. may be used for schooling on the flat but are not permissible over fences, over poles on the ground, or in the competition ring.

Sheepskin may be used on each cheek piece of the bridle providing the sheepskin does not exceed 3cm in diameter measured from the horse's face.

In the competition arena:

- a) Blinkers are forbidden.
- b) If running martingales are used, they must be unrestricted (for use of standing martingales, see Article G502)
- c) Reins must be attached to the bit(s) or directly to the bridle. Gags and hackamores are allowed in jumper classes in accordance with EC rules.

Anywhere on the competition grounds:

- a) In the interests of safety, the stirrup iron and the stirrup leather (this also applies to safe stirrups) must hang freely from the bar of the saddle and the outside of the flap. There be no other restrictions or attachments of any kind. The competitor must not directly or indirectly tie any part of his body to the saddlery.
- b) Competitors are allowed to use a dressage whip when working on the flat but are strictly forbidden to use or carry a whip which is weighed down at the end at any time, or to ca use one which is more than 75 cm in length in the arena or schooling areas, when ridin poles or over any obstacles. No substitute for a whip may be carried.

ATTIRE

Riders are to be neatly and suitably attired. White breeches are requested for Mini-Prix and Prix's. Beige breeches are acceptable attire for Hunter Specials, Classics and Medal classes. Formal Dress (Shadbelly) is encouraged but not required for Hunter Classics and Hunter Derbies. When permitted by the show committee, riders may show in the jumper ring in a solid-coloured collared shirt or an MHJA shirt. Striped or multi-coloured shirts are not permissible — exception Beach Party Show, where rules will be posted. Tank tops are not permitted while riding anywhere on the show grounds. At all EC sanctioned competitions, all competitors (including foreign competitors) in EC National classes must wear ASTM /SEI or BSI/BSEN approved helmets, with the safety harness correctly fastened at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Each exhibitor, or parent/guardian of exhibitors who are minors, agrees that photographs taken of the exhibitor by any photographer approved by the MHJA may be used for promotional purposes by the MHJA or its official sponsors. EC Amateurs may not use their name, photograph or any form of a personal association as a horse person in connection with any advertisement or article sold.

PROTESTS

All protests must be made to the MHJA Show Manager in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash or certified cheque as per EC Rules where applicable. Such protests must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Show Manager/Chairperson within 48 hours after the completion of the Class concerned.

NON-COMPETING HORSES

MHJA members may bring horses for <u>training on the warm-up day only</u> of competitions at either BHP or RRX. There will be no stabling for these horses. Any ring may be used and a fee of \$65 will be assessed. Payment, waiver, and proof of Coggins and vaccination must be received by close of entries and horses will have a number assigned. These horses are not eligible to enter any classes but are governed by the Rules of EC and by the rules and regulations of the horse show and are bound by EC drug rules. Both competitive and non-competing horses are subject to drug testing. MHC, EC and MHJA membership is required.

SHOW COMMITTEE DECISIONS

The Show Committee/Show Manager reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules and to correct any error in the Prize List or Program. All owners, trainers, competitors, and grooms agree to the acceptance of these interpretations and additional ruling by virtue of your signed entry.

Open to all horses, ponies and riders.

To be eligible for National EC points at Heart of the Continent only. Open to junior and adult amateur riders only. No cross-entry for riders into classes higher than 3'6"(See EC article G307 ad 309)

HACK DIVISION

Open to all horses over 14.2 hands. Judged 55% on performance, 20% on quality and 10% manners. Horses must enter the ring at a walk. In the event of a tie for Champion, the horses must be shown in hand & judged on conformation. Champion and Reserve will be awarded on combined hack placings (i.e. – Road and Show hack combined).

OPEN ROAD HACK (ARTICLE G1302) - Entry fee \$15/class

Class 51, 52

Ribbons to 6th

Must present an appearance of overall substance with refinement. Soundness is required and blemishes may be penalized. Horse to be shown at a flat-footed walk, with reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. No more than 8 horses will gallop at one time.

OPEN SHOW HACK (ARTICLE G1301) - Entry fee \$15/class

Class 53, 54

Ribbons to 6th

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop; collected and extended gate to be called for; to stand quietly. No more than 8 horses will gallop at one time.

HUNTER DERBY

\$500 COMBINED HUNTER DERBY - Entry fee \$50

CLASS 62 \$150-\$125-\$100-\$75-\$50-R

To be held at Summer Smiles & Fall Harvest 2025. The Hunter Derby is a high-performance hunter class which presents competitors with the opportunity to showcase the talents of both horse and rider over a more challenging course. Handiness and the demonstration of inside turns are rewarded with higher points. The Derby combines a Hunter Classic and a Handy Hunter into one round. This format is exciting for both riders and spectators, encouraging riders to lay it on the line with bold, forward riding right from the start. The course may include the banks, grob, hedges and combinations along with traditional hunter fences.

The Hunter Derby will be run as a split height:

For horses competing at 2'9" and lower at the show, the fences will be 2'6" with options up to 2'9". For horses competing at 3'0" and higher at the show, the fences will be 2'9" with options up to 3'0".

The course will be open for walking prior to the start of the class. The class is judged as a Handy Hunter, with a score announced immediately after each horse has finished its round. Two bonus points are awarded for each high-performance option taken on course (for example higher or more challenging fences). Additionally, two bonus points are awarded for each handy option taken on course (for example inside turns, halt, trot fence, route taken on roll backs, unique approaches, boldness and an impressionable start etc.) Immediately after the horse on course finishes, the scores will be announced as follows: total for performance, total for more difficult fences taken, total for handiness and a grand total for each horse and rider combination.

There is no jog required for this class. No cross-entry into class 71 - True North Medal.

CLASS 600

Cooler to winner; Ribbons to 6th

To be held at Summer Smiles & Fall Harvest 2025. An introduction to hunter derbies with fences set at 2'3" with 2'6" options. The class will be conducted over a lengthened track judged with a hunter score and low/high jump options. No handy requirements.

There is no jog required for this class.

No cross-entry into class 71 - True North Medal. or class 62 Hunter Derby. Class 62 may not cross enter into this class.

Jumper classes above 1.0m will be run according to a set order of go. The order may be changed in exceptional circumstances only, such as one rider showing multiple horses in the same class.

(Article G706: a minimum of 10 horses to go in between each horse ridden by the same rider).

The jumper ring will have scheduling priority and conflicts in the Hunter Ring will not be considered sufficient to change the jumper Order of Go in the Jumper Ring on Jumper Derby Day.

There will be only one course walk for both the 'JA' & 'Open' divisions of the 0.85m, 0.90m and 1.0m jumper classes; these will run as one class with two separate cards.

A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement, but downward movement is restricted to only one level and is based on the level of the first class in which they have competed at that show.

Post entries: In classes where post or late entries are permitted and accepted after the draw is made, the post/late entry shall go first in the Order of Go.

Open to all horses over 14.2 hands. Judged 55% on performance, 20% on quality and 10% manners. Horses must enter the ring at a walk. In the event of a tie for Champion, the horses must be shown in hand & judged on conformation. Champion and Reserve will be awarded on combined hack placings (i.e. – Road and Show hack combined).

Must present an appearance of overall substance with refinement. Soundness is required and blemishes may be penalized. Horse to be shown at a flat-footed walk, with reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. No more than 8 horses will gallop at one time.

HUNTER DERBY

\$500 COMBINED HUNTER DERBY - Entry fee \$50

CLASS 62 \$150-\$125-\$100-\$75-\$50-R

To be held at Summer Smiles & Fall Harvest 2025. The Hunter Derby is a high-performance hunter class which presents competitors with the opportunity to showcase the talents of both horse and rider over a more challenging course. Handiness and the demonstration of inside turns are rewarded with higher points. The Derby combines a Hunter Classic and a Handy Hunter into one round. This format is exciting for both riders and spectators, encouraging riders to lay it on the line with bold, forward riding right from the start. The course may include the banks, grob, hedges and combinations along with traditional hunter fences.

The Hunter Derby will be run as a split height:

For horses competing at 2'9" and lower at the show, the fences will be 2'6" with options up to 2'9". For horses competing at 3'0" and higher at the show, the fences will be 2'9" with options up to 3'0".

The course will be open for walking prior to the start of the class. The class is judged as a Handy Hunter, with a score announced immediately after each horse has finished its round. Two bonus points are awarded for each high-performance option taken on course (for example higher or more challenging fences). Additionally, two bonus points are awarded for each handy option taken on course (for example inside turns, halt, trot fence, route taken on roll backs, unique approaches, boldness and an impressionable start etc.) Immediately after the horse on course finishes, the scores will be announced as follows: total for performance, total for more difficult fences taken, total for handiness and a grand total for each horse and rider combination.

There is no jog required for this class. No cross-entry into class 71 - True North Medal.

Cooler to winner; Ribbons to 6th

To be held at Summer Smiles & Fall Harvest 2025. An introduction to hunter derbies with fences set at 2'3" with 2'6" options. The class will be conducted over a lengthened track judged with a hunter score and low/high jump options. No handy requirements.

There is no jog required for this class.

No cross-entry into class 71 - True North Medal. or class 62 Hunter Derby. Class 62 may not cross enter into this class.

Jumper classes above 1.0m will be run according to a set order of go. The order may be changed in exceptional circumstances only, such as one rider showing multiple horses in the same class.

(Article G706: a minimum of 10 horses to go in between each horse ridden by the same rider).

The jumper ring will have scheduling priority and conflicts in the Hunter Ring will not be considered sufficient to change the jumper Order of Go in the Jumper Ring on Jumper Derby Day.

There will be only one course walk for both the 'JA' & 'Open' divisions of the 0.85m, 0.90m and 1.0m jumper classes; these will run as one class with two separate cards.

A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement, but downward movement is restricted to only one level and is based on the level of the first class in which they have competed at that show.

Post entries: In classes where post or late entries are permitted and accepted after the draw is made, the post/late entry shall go first in the Order of Go.
