## ENTRY PROCEDURE



### PLEASE READ CAREFULLY:

- All competitors will be required to submit a non-refundable deposit (stall and office fee) of \$135.00 at time of entry via ShowGroundsLive. A credit card number is required to cover your deposit. No exception. Eransfers are not accepted.
- All entries must be completed on showgroundslive.com by the closing date for the show listed in the prize list. If you have not used this program before, go to ShowGrounds Live and create an account. Find the Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association page from the show management company drop down menu on the main page and enter online.
- Membership numbers for MHJA & MHC will be required upon entry. Please update your SGL profile to include all your current year membership numbers. Waivers should also be signed on SGL.
- Horse health documents should be submitted to the entry secretary upon entry via the [2026 MHJA Horse Health Recording](#).
- Entries will not be considered complete until your membership info & all your horse's health documents have been received. Incomplete entries may be placed on a waitlist, and complete entries will get priority.
- Once you have entered, you will be able to review your invoices and close out your accounts at the end of the show. You'll also be able to add/scratch your classes for the following day's competitions until 6:00pm each competition day.
- Failure to close out your account by 8pm of the Monday following the show, will result in a \$50 Bandit fee to your competitor account. Accounts in arrears past this may be subject to further late penalties and interest on the amount owing. Those with unpaid accounts will not be permitted to enter any shows until the account is paid in full and will be placed on a "credit hold" on Show Grounds Live. The hold will not be removed until such time as the balance is paid.
- Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in the preparation of their entry forms. Juniors must have a parent or guardian sign their entry form/waiver.
- **\*\*NEW FOR 2026\*\***A Show Grounds Live – Platform Fee will be applied to each horse entry in the competition. This fee supports the software platform used to manage entries, scheduling, results, and communications for both exhibitors and show staff.
  - The fee is charged once per horse entered in the system (referred to as an "Entry").
  - The fee for the 2026 Season is \$10 USD but is subject to change
  - It will be charged to the Responsible Party designated for the entry. By default, this is the Owner, but a different individual may be assigned.
  - The fee is not charged for Trainer Accounts (entries created solely to account for trainer-related charges)
  - This fee is charged directly by Show Grounds Live. As a result, exhibitors may see more than one charge on their credit card or bank account (if using ACH payments) — one from the show organizer and one from [ShowGroundsLive](#).
  - Online entries are charged the Platform Fee at the time the entry is submitted. For manually entered entries, the fee will be charged during the checkout process.
- Each entry is secured with a designated payment credit card. While exhibitors may choose any payment card during checkout, manually entered entries (created by the show office) will use the default Credit Card payment method on file for the Responsible Party.

**Entries will not be considered complete until all your documents and your deposit have been received.**

**Members not in good standing are ineligible for prize monies, and year end awards.**

### **MEMBERSHIPS \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- For insurance purposes, all riders and owners must have a current Manitoba Horse Council (MHC) membership or membership with their own provincial/territorial sport organization (PTSO) if they are from out of province.
- MHJA Memberships are also required to compete at all MHJA Shows. MHJA Membership fees help to pay for things such as jumps and jump maintenance. Memberships also allow us to track points throughout the year and offer year-end awards to our competitors. **Owners, Riders and Coaches must be members.**
- Owners, Riders and Coaches MUST be in current good standing to be allowed to attend MHJA Sanctioned events.
- “In Good Standing” is defined as the following:
  - Current, Correct Memberships with both MHJA & MHC
  - All outstanding balances from prior shows, and Membership must be paid in full.
  - Volunteer fee paid, or hours are scheduled as outlined in the Volunteer Agreement when purchasing Membership.
  - MHJA reserves the right to refuse entry if the Rider, Owner or Coach are not in good standing.
- The following memberships are required at each show:
  - **Victoria Day** - Prairie Crocus (Provincial) – MHJA Heritage or Full MHJA membership & MHC Competitive Membership
  - **Summer out of the City** - Prairie Crocus (Provincial) – MHJA Heritage or Full MHJA membership & MHC Competitive Membership
  - **Jump into Fall** - Prairie Crocus (Provincial) – MHJA Heritage or Full MHJA membership & MHC Competitive Membership

### **TEMPORARY MEMBERSHIPS \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Temporary Memberships are available for Heritage Shows ONLY and will only be available to Members of affiliated clubs with whom MHJA has an agreement signed.
- The following club members in good standing can pay \$30.00 per show to compete at MHJA Heritage shows & we will waive the volunteer requirements & fees.
  - Manitoba Horse Trials
  - Manitoba Pony Club
- Proof of CURRENT YEAR membership for the above must be provided to the secretary at [mhjaentries@gmail.com](mailto:mhjaentries@gmail.com)

### **COACH/TRAINER INFORMATION \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Coaches at MHJA events must hold an EC Coach License, or Registered Status.
- Please see the EC Coach status program for more information.
- MHC’s Community Coaching designation is **NOT** recognized as an official coach status to coach at MHJA shows as it lacks MHJA’s Coaching insurance requirements.
- When registering for MHJA competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached.
- Declaring yourself as self-coached is a liability risk. MHJA strongly suggests that you carry your own personal insurance in this situation.
- All coaches must be licensed to set fences and coach in both the competition rings and the warm-up rings.

**\*\*\* Coaches found to be coaching without a coach status may be fined and asked to leave the premises.**

### **CHANGE OF ENTRIES \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Classes may be signed up for using Show Grounds Live.
- You may add and scratch online.
- Please advise the gate of all same day changes.
- Horses are limited to 4 classes over fences.
- All eligible under saddle classes may be entered.

### **CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Prior to the closing date, a vet or doctor's note is required for a refund on the stall deposit.
- Regardless of reason, the \$135.00 deposit (stall and office fee) is non-refundable after the closing date.
- The stall for the cancelled entry will revert to the show for re-assignment.
- If we have a waitlist and can fill the stall, the stall deposit will be refunded.
- The office fee is nonrefundable.
- Substitution of horses is permitted if the show secretary is notified prior to the start of the show. The substitution fee is \$35.00.
- There will be no substitution after the start of the show. (10:00am on warm-up day)

### **CANCELLATION OF CLASSES**

- If a class does not fill and is cancelled, the Gate Manager shall notify the exhibitors at the earliest possible opportunity.
- No class will be cancelled if there are 5 or more entries.
- A competition may, at its discretion, hold a class with fewer than 4 entries.
- Note: Competitors are asked to advise the in-gate immediately when they are scratching from an event, and/or from the remainder of the competition.

### **SITE DEVELOPMENT FEE (MHC Equestrian Centre)**

- There is a site development fee of \$5 per horse that goes towards maintaining and upgrading the facility.

### **NUMBERS**

- Horses are required to wear the number assigned to them.
- Every entry will be assigned an identification number by the competition organizing committee once your entry has been pre-paid, on-line waivers have been signed, and horse health paperwork has been received. Should the competitor have an outstanding balance, they will not receive the show number and will not be permitted to compete. Any outstanding balance must be paid in full prior to the competitor receiving their number and being allowed to compete.
- Numbers must be always worn and visible in the barn, schooling, exercise and practice areas as well as in the competition rings. Please put numbers on before entering the warmup areas. Each horse uses the same number each time it enters the ring at that show, including Equitation Classes.

### STABLING

- Priority for stabling will be given to horses entered for the entire show. Please name the barn/coach with whom you wish to be stabled with. Management will try to honor all written requests for stabling together.
- An emergency contact & phone number along with Daily AM & PM Temperature checks MUST be displayed on stall doors. Failure to do so will result in a \$10 fine being added to your account.
- Stalls must be thoroughly cleaned and sufficiently bedded daily by 10:00 a.m. every day.
- All refuse must be placed in designated areas.
- Aisles must be kept clean.
- Individual competitors will be responsible for any extra cost resulting from excessive damage to stalls, and any damage must be reported to the Show Office.
- Excessive amounts of shavings left in the stall at the end of the show will result in additional clean-out charges.

### TACK STALLS

- Priority will be given to large groups if space becomes limited.

### UNSTABLED HORSES/DAILY SHIP-INS (MHC Equestrian Centre)

- As per MHC policy, all unstabled horses are subject to a Grounds Fee of \$10 per day, per horse.
- Haul-ins must park trailers in designated parking spots.

### HORSES TIED TO OR STANDING IN TRAILERS MUST ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:

- Horses must be supervised at all times and cannot be left unattended.
- Food and water must be available at all times.
- Any concerns on the part of the Competition Organizers and/or Officials must be addressed immediately.
- The location for tying will be determined by the Equestrian Centre Manager and may change according to demand.
- Adequate hay and water must be provided, and clean-up of the area must occur.
- The trailer in which the horse is tied to, or standing in, must be attached to a truck.
- During inclement weather, horses need to be provided shelter in a temporary stall (BHP) or an empty stall (RREX) while the weather passes. If no stalls are available, the horse(s) will need to be transported home.

### VET AND FARRIER

- A Farrier and Vet will be available on an on-call basis.
- Their Name and Contact Information are posted on the first page of this prize list.

### FIRST AID

- Medics will be in attendance during schooling and competition hours and warm-up day.
- Please call 911 in case of emergency at other times if needed.

**\*\*\*No jumping will be permitted until the medic is present.**

### ARRIVAL

- Horses will be allowed on the showgrounds at 10:00 am on the morning of warm-ups, but not prior to, the first day of warm-ups without prior authorization.
- The competition rules are in effect upon the arrival of the first horse on the competition grounds.
- All entries will have stalls assigned prior to arrival. Please check the posted list or for stall assignment.
- Riding is at your own risk and on the flat only until the Steward and medics are present.

### SCHOOLING/WARM-UP ROUNDS \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\*

- All MHJA-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. Refer to FEI Rules, [Article 242 Warm-Up Arena](#).
- These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation and jumper classes and divisions at all MHJA sanctioned competitions.
- A Schooling Fee is included for all horses entered in each show.
- Each participant is eligible to enter a schooling block with their coach.
- **New for 2026, warm-up blocks for each rider will be entered by the Coach/Rider on SGL on the Wednesday before the show at noon.**
- **All entries will be limited to 1 warm-up block at time of sign up on Wednesday.**
- **If there is availability, two may be entered (one for each ring. Unfilled blocks will open on Thursday at noon.**
- The number of horses in the schooling rings is limited to 6.
- Please be courteous of others and do not go over your allotted time in the ring.

### PRACTICE AREAS & SCHOOLING

- Times, rules and locations for lunging and schooling will be posted.
- Schooling will only be permitted in designated areas, at designated times

### PARKING

- Designated parking areas for cars, trailers, vans, and campers will be enforced.
- Horse trailers may not be parked in the barn area during the horse show except for immediate loading/unloading.
- Competitors, Family and Associates must be parked in the designated parking areas.
- There will be NO PARKING IN THE BARN AREAS except for coaches, people with mobility issues and valid handicap passes.
- Please see facility maps for designated parking areas. Parking passes may be picked up at the office on warm-up day.

### PETS

- Dogs cannot be loose and must be properly leashed at all times on the show grounds. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- Dogs are not permitted in the warm-up ring or in-gate area or in the food tent area.
- The Show will fine owners \$50 per incident, per dog, for dogs not on leashes. This will be added to your show tab, and you will not be allowed to compete at another MHJA show until the fine has been paid.
- For biosecurity reasons, dogs are not permitted in horse stalls.

### EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- Coggins:
  - All horses being brought onto the grounds for any competition must have a current **NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST** completed within 12 months prior to the move in date of the show. Horses will be prohibited from entering the grounds in the absence of a valid Coggins test being submitted to the show secretary.
- Proof of Vaccination:
  - You must provide proof of vaccination for **ALL** of your horses on the grounds, showing or not.
    - A letter from a veterinarian or invoice from a veterinarian is satisfactory and should be submitted to the show secretary at time of entry.
  - Required Vaccines are as follows:
    - Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months +/- a 21-day grace period. Keep copies of your Vaccination records in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by show organizers to present your health papers at any time.
- Proof of Negative Coggins and Vaccination must be submitted to the entry secretary with the following link:
  - [2026 Horse Health Documents](#)
- A temperature check should also be done 3 days before the first day of the show.
- Ship-Ins/Daily Haul-Ins:
  - If you ship in and out daily, keep copies of your Vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You may be asked to present these records.
- It is highly recommended that horses are also vaccinated for West Nile Virus.

### **EQUINE BIOSECURITY AND EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS **\*\*Revised for 2026\*\*****

- The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans, and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva, and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact. Please observe the following biosecurity protocols: Limit horse-to-horse contact
- Limit contact between horses and other horses, humans, and other animals.
- Restrict unnecessary movement of horses out of their aisle or barn.
  - Do not take a horse to another barn to be tacked up, braided, clipped, etc.
  - Sharing equipment and grooming supplies or coming into contact with other horses or soiled surfaces can spread germs.
- Do not lead horses down other tent/barn aisles. Use the exit closest to you for exiting the barns
- Do not let horses make nose-to-nose contact with horses from other barns when in common areas such as:
  - wash racks
  - at the rings,
  - while grazing.
- Do not touch, pet, or feed treats to horses from other barns.
- Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spread them via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.
- Do not let water hoses touch buckets when filling.

- Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.
- Do not allow horses to drink from the hose. Do not share water or feed buckets.
- Use clean brushes and towels on each horse. If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to wash them often.
- Do not share tack and equipment, especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.
- Monitor your horse's temperature and contact the Show Veterinarian if you notice any unusual symptoms.
- **ALL HORSES MUST HAVE A TEMPERATURE CHART ON THEIR STALL WITH AN AM & PM TEMP TAKEN AND RECORDED FOR EACH SHOW DAY. FAILURE TO HAVE THIS WILL RESULT IN A \$10.00 FINE BEING APPLIED TO YOUR ACCOUNT**

**\*\*\*Please be prepared to take your Horse's Temperature at any time for Show Management\*\*\***

### **HUMAN BIOSECURITY GUIDELINES**

- All competitors, owners, coaches, volunteers and show personnel are responsible for following Manitoba Health guidelines when on the showgrounds.
- All attendees at any MHJA show must familiarize themselves with these procedures to help protect their own health, as well as the health of others in our community.
- All participants should be mindful to frequently wash their hands or use hand sanitizer.

### **MEDICATION CONTROL (DRUG TESTING) \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- Every entry at an MHJA sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the rules set by MHJA, in compliance with the EC Constitution pertaining to Medication Control.
- It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in MHJA sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution, and the applicable rules of EC as they are imposed by MHJA Heritage competitions.
- Do not participate in an MHJA sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC pertaining to Medication Control.

### **DRUG FEES \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Any horse entered in an MHJA Heritage competition is paying a drug testing fee as part of their entry fee.
- All entries, while on the competition grounds, and on the recommendation of the Show Manager, Judges, or Show Committee may be selected for equine medication control testing.
- All owners agree that by making their entry, they will allow their horses to be tested.
- All horses are assessed for a horse/pony drug fee and are subject to drug testing.
- A fee of \$5.00/horse will be submitted per entry to the MHC Medications control fund for this purpose.

### STALLIONS

- Junior exhibitors may not ride, drive, show on the line or handle stallions on the grounds.

### SHOW RULES & ETIQUETTE

- The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to refuse, limit, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries; disqualify any riders or exhibitors thereby cancelling awarded prizes; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to change rings and/or officials, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors and to intercept all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, any incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind.
- Posted notice will be given to all exhibitors in the event of a change in the program.
- The abuse or inhumane treatment of horses and/or humans will not be tolerated.
- Any unsportsmanlike conduct or use of abusive language by any person towards any other person will not be tolerated.
- Contemptuous comments and interference towards officials will not be tolerated.
- No person, other than officials, the Show Committee or Show Management may enter the show ring without the permission of Show Management.
- Any of the above actions might result in removal from show, forfeiture of prizes and possible exclusion from exhibiting for one or more years.
- In the interest of the horse, competitors are asked to limit the number of classes for horses that are shown.
  - At Victoria Day, Summer out of the City and Jump into Fall, each horse is limited to four (4) over fences classes per day.

### RINGSIDE BEHAVIOUR

- It is inappropriate to shout instructions to or critique a rider as they are focusing on their course.
- Providing some guidance in a normal speaking voice when the rider is near the ingate is acceptable, however shouting instructions in a loud manner while the rider is in the ring is very distracting to everyone in the vicinity (including the judge) and may penalize performance.
- Please be considerate of everyone at the show and limit ringside coaching to appropriate levels.

### CONCUSSION PROTOCOLS AND RETURN TO PLAY POLICY

- All MHJA competitions will adhere to Sport Manitoba/Equestrian Canada 'Return to Play' guidelines when assessing a rider's ability to continue in the competition following a possible head injury.
- The guidelines and descriptions of concussive head injuries can be found at [www.parachutecanada.org](http://www.parachutecanada.org) and will be posted in the show office at each competition.
- In conjunction with the onsite medics, the Show Committee will have discretion as to whether a rider will be allowed to continue in the competition following a suspected concussive head injury and will be made solely to prevent any further injury or long-term harm to that rider.

### ATTIRE

- Riders are to be neat and suitably attired for a schooling show.
- Tank tops are not permitted while riding anywhere on the show grounds.
- At all MHJA sanctioned competitions, all competitors (including foreign competitors) must wear ASTM /SEI or BSI/BSEN approved helmets, with the safety harness correctly fastened, at all times, while mounted on the competition grounds.
- Boots with a proper riding heel must also always be worn while mounted.

### TACK AND EQUIPMENT

- For Hunter tack please see: Rules of Equestrian Canada, [Article G202](#)
- Draw reins must be used in a safe manner. Draw reins are permitted in the schooling area. Draw reins are permitted over fences if used in the following manner:
  - Attached to the girth, running through the front legs and secured at the neck.
  - Attached to the breastplate.
  - Attached to the girth at the billet straps; or
  - Attached to the d-rings at the front of the saddle.
- Standing martingales, German martingales and draw reins secured as above will be permitted in jumper classes where the height of the fences does not exceed 1.15m.
- Junior, amateur or non-pro riders may not compete in draw reins or German martingales.
- Restrictive devices such as the de Gogue, Chambon, running reins etc. may be used for schooling on the flat but are not permissible over fences, over poles on the ground, or in the competition ring.
- Sheepskin may be used on each cheek piece of the bridle, providing the sheepskin does not exceed 3cm in diameter measured from the horse's face.
- In the competition arena:
  - Blinkers are forbidden.
  - If running martingales are used, they must be unrestricted (for use of standing martingales, see [Article G202](#))
  - Reins must be attached to the bit(s) or directly to the bridle. Gags and hackamores are allowed in jumper classes in accordance with EC rules. Anywhere on the competition grounds:
    - In the interests of safety, the stirrup iron and the stirrup leather (this also applies to safety stirrups) must hang freely from the bar of the saddle and the outside of the flap. There must be no other restrictions or attachments of any kind. The competitor must not directly or indirectly tie any part of his body to the saddlery.
- Competitors are allowed to use a dressage whip when working on the flat but are strictly forbidden to use or carry a whip which is weighed down at the end at any time, or to carry or use one which is more than 75 cm in length in the arena or schooling areas, when riding over poles or over any obstacles. No substitute for a whip may be carried.

### PROTESTS

- All protests must be made to the MHJA Show Manager in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash or certified cheque where applicable.
- Such protests must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Show Manager/Chairperson within 48 hours after the completion of the Class concerned.

### NON-COMPETING HORSES

- MHJA members in good standing may bring horses for training on the warm-up day at any Heritage competition.
- There will be no stabling for these horses.
- Either ring may be signed up to do warm-ups, and a fee of \$65 will be assessed.
- Payment, waiver, and proof of Coggins and vaccination must be received by close of entries, at which time the horse will have a number assigned.
- These horses are not eligible to enter any classes but are governed by the Rules of MHJA and by the rules and regulations of the horse show.
- MHC and MHJA memberships are required.

### **HORS CONCOURS \*\*\* Revised for 2026\*\*\***

- Professional's Hors Concours:
  - Trainers, Coaches and Non-Pro's may ride in any J/A class Hors Concours.
  - However, results will not count for ribbons or Developing Rider Award points.
  - Please sign up on Show Grounds Live.
- End Of Day Schooling:
  - Hors Concours entries will also be accepted at the end of the show day in both rings after judged classes are completed.
  - Riders will be allowed 10-minutes per schooling session. Their coach may join them in the arena.
  - Jumps may be safely altered, ie. a back rail may be removed on an oxer, but they must be returned to the way they were at the end of the round.
  - Unsafe/illegal jumps may not be jumped. Ie. Gates/boxes without a pole over them.
  - Please see the EC and FEI rule books for more detailed pictures of illegal jumps.
  - Any unsafe behavior or riding may result in the horse and rider being excused from the show, by show management.
- J/A Hors Concours:
  - J/A may do an Hors Concours Class, if need be, however riders may not compete again on the day after doing hors concours rounds.
- Hors Concurs over fences will count towards the 4 class limit.

Open to anyone competing up to 2'3" - The Horse will jump a course, then immediately after a dog runs its course. The fastest combined horse & dog time will win the class. Judged under Table C speed.

**J/A Mini Take your own line:**

**Class 62**

Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup>

In this competition, the obstacles may be jumped only once in the order chosen by the Athlete. Any Athlete who does not jump all the obstacles is eliminated. Combination obstacles are not allowed. Athletes may cross the starting line and finish line in either direction. Obstacles may be jumped in either direction, unless otherwise directed on the course plan. This competition takes under Table C. All disobediences are penalized by the time lost by the Athlete. If there is a refusal or run-out with a knock-down or displacement of the obstacle, the Athlete may only restart his round when the obstacle knocked down or displaced has been replaced and when the Ground Jury gives him the signal to start. He may then jump the obstacle of his choice. In this case, 6 seconds for time correction (see JRs Art. 232) will be added to the time of the round. Fences will be set at 2'3"
