Ec Rules and regulations

General rules & regulations:

The Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby is sanctioned as a: Gold competition member of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC. Every class offered here in is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. If there is a discrepancy between the rules listed in this section and the 2026 rules, the 2026 rules will take precedence.

Person Responsible:

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles - Horse Welfare:

1. Equestrian Canada (EC) is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all participants that is free from Abuse. The purpose of this Policy is to stress the importance of that commitment by educating Individuals and the public about Horse Abuse, outlining how EC will work to prevent Horse Abuse, and how such Abuse or suspected Abuse can be reported to and addressed by EC.
2. EC requires that all Individuals adhere to this Code of Conduct and acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the Horse must always be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.
3. Section A Horse Welfare rules apply to all disciplines and all Section Rule Books. Rule exceptions in other Sections that contravene Section A Horse Welfare rules are not permitted and will not be approved.
4. EC is committed to:
 - a. recognizing Horses as sentient beings, defined by the ability to feel, perceive or experience subjectively. (ie. The animal is not only capable of feeling pain and distress but also can have positive psychological experiences, such as comfort, pleasure or interest that are appropriate to its species, environment, and circumstances. To state that animals are sentient accepts that they can experience positive and negative emotions.

- b. upholding the welfare of the Horse, regardless of value and performance level, as the primary priority regardless of competitive commitments, expectations, or commercial influences;
- c. requiring the Horse to be treated with the highest level of care, compassion, respect, and empathy;
- d. requiring that no Horse be subjected to Abuse (ref: Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A General Regulations, Article A517) or Distress;
- e. ensuring that all Individuals accept and implement, at a minimum, the requirements within the National Farm Animal Care Council Equine Code of Practice;
- f. ongoing support for scientific studies of animal-based indicators of pain, Page 1 2026 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A
- g. Distress, and/or compromised welfare; increasing education and awareness for the evolution of best management and equine husbandry practices;
- h. requiring Individuals to know and follow the EC rules and implement industry regulations in all competitions;
- i. and, reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Coaches:

- When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached.
- Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with EC and must declare/have proof of insurance.
- See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, for EC's Safe Sport requirements
- For the purpose of participation in EC-sanctioned competitions and meeting EC minimum requirements for Safe Sport coaching eligibility, there are two (2) recognized EC Coach Status designations:
 - Registered Coach Status: Self-declared coaches and instructors, and those working toward a recognized coaching certification/license.
 - Licensed Coach Status: Coaches with knowledge and expertise achieved through formal certification, education, or validated practical experience. 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. EC Coach Status is required for all Canadian residents coaching athletes at EC-sanctioned competitions.
- EC Coach Status must be renewed annually, and it is the responsibility of the individual holding EC Coach Status to ensure all component requirements for Coach Status are current and valid. Coaches who do not meet minimum Coach Status requirements at the time of competition may receive a fine as outlined in EC's Schedule of Fines & Penalties, and/or the horse/rider's points may be invalidated.
- Temporary EC Coach Status will be permanently discontinued after December 31, 2025.

- Reports that an individual is coaching at EC-sanctioned competitions or programs without the required EC Coach Status must be submitted using the official complaint form to the Independent Third Party Complaints Manager, in accordance with the EC Discipline, Complaints and Appeal Policy. If the matter is determined by the Complaints Manager to relate solely to EC's technical rules regarding Coach Status, it may be referred back to EC for handling. In such cases, the challenge will proceed in accordance with EC's internal procedures.

MHC PRAIRIE CROCUS SANCTIONED CLASSES ARE TO RUN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MHC PRAIRIE CROCUS COMPETITION RULES.

- Every eventuality cannot be provided for in these rules. It is the duty of the officials and the competition management to decide in the spirit of sport, approaching as near as possible the intention of these rules, and to protect the reputation of the sport and the welfare of the horse.
- Competition organizers should be familiar with the MHC Prairie Crocus rules and policies and should have copies available for all individuals present.
- Competitions may expand upon the rules; provided notification of changes is printed in the competition's prize list.
- Under no circumstances may any changes contradict the MHC rule requirements pertaining to safety.
- All MHC Prairie Crocus sanctioned competitions are restricted to MHC members in good standing. All competitors must have a current MHC membership, including riders in lead line classes.
- Out of province competitors are eligible to compete; however, they must provide proof of membership with their home Provincial/Territorial Sport Organization (PTSO) or will be required to purchase an MHC membership.
- Any major change from the format of the Prairie Crocus Competition Program must receive the approval of the MHC Board of Directors prior to implementation.
- If it is found that the Prairie Crocus rules require further interpretation for the level of competition present, the Equestrian Canada (EC) rules will prevail.

Rules and Regulations

Sport Licenses and Horse Recording:

Riders and owners competing in an EC-rated class at the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby must have a minimum Gold EC sport license and a Horse Recording. An EC Sport License is required for residents of Canada who are competitors, owners or lessees, and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry in EC sanctioned competitions.

Medication control:

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.

Vaccinations:

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. All horses must also meet the health and biosecurity requirements set out in this prize list.

Memberships, horse recordings and vaccination paperwork:

For insurance purposes, all coaches, riders and owners must have a current Manitoba Horse Council (MHC) membership or membership with their own provincial/territorial sport organization (PTSO) from out of province.

This includes LEADLINE participants. At a minimum, an MHC Lead line membership must be held by all lead line participants.

Coaches, Riders and Owners must be members in good standing with MHJA and hold a full MHJA Jr or Sr Membership

Owners, Riders and Coaches MUST be current members in good standing with MHC, MHJA (and EC) to be allowed to attend

- **Equestrian Canada: sport license card (minimum Gold level) If competing in one of the EC rated classes.**
- **Horse recording number if competing in one of the EC rated classes.**
- **Manitoba Horse Council: membership card**
- **MHJA: membership number**
- **Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby waiver**
- **Vaccination (influenza and EHV 1&4) records within 6 months +/- 21-day grace period - A negative Coggins test (valid within 12 months)**

All the required paperwork must have been received by the show secretary before Saturday July 4th 2026.

Coach Status

When registering for an EC sanctioned competition, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A, General regulations, A 102, Safe Sport Environments.

- Canadian Coaches must hold a minimum Licensed EC Coach Status or upgrade their EC Registered status for each EC event they are coaching at. Please see EC Rule Book Article A103 & G107.6 for more information.
- MHC Community Coaching designation is NOT recognized as an official coach status to coach at the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby as it lacks coaching insurance requirements.
- When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form, or they must specify that they are self-coached.
- Declaring yourself as self-coached is a liability risk. The organizing committee strongly suggests that you carry your own personal insurance in this situation.

Safe sport

Please see Equestrian Canada's Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, for the Safe Sport protocol. Safe Sport became Effective in 2022. To compete in EC Classes, all EC Sport License Holders must complete safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion awareness.

Province of Manitoba and Sport Manitoba Launch The Protecting Youth in Sports Act

April 1, 2026. Manitoba Horse Council has adopted Safe Sport Policy Manual.

The Protecting Youth in Sports Act requires Sport Manitoba and all Provincial Sport Organizations (PSOs) including MHC (and their member clubs) to work together to create safer, more accountable sport environments. At its core, the Act establishes clear expectations, consistent education, and independent oversight to help prevent and address maltreatment in sport.

Here's what that means:

- Clear, province-wide safe sport policies: All organizations must follow a shared Safe Sport Policy outlining expected behaviour and prohibited conduct for coaches, athlete support personnel, athletes (21 and under), and parents.
- Education for prevention: Athletes, parents, and coaches receive resources and training to recognize, prevent, and report maltreatment.

- Independent complaint handling: Reports of maltreatment are reviewed by an independent adjudicator, ensuring fair, transparent investigations and decisions.
- Stronger accountability across sport: Disciplinary outcomes apply across all recognized sport organizations, helping prevent individuals from moving between programs without oversight.

Creating safer sport is a shared responsibility – this legislation helps ensure everyone plays a role

Canadian Anti-Doping Program

Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A-Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for details.

Birth date:

Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year, are classified as juniors. All Juniors must state their birth date on the entry form, and birth certificates are to be made available upon request.

Junior competitors:

All Junior competitors are subject to the Junior Headgear Rule (A905) "
Classes with JA attached are restricted to Junior and Amateur riders.

Helmets:

It is mandatory that all persons mounted on a horse anywhere on the show grounds wear protective headgear secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet. Please refer to Article G102 of the 2017 Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section G Hunter, Jumper.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

General information

Office hours:

The office is open from 12:00 p.m.–7:00 p.m. on the warm up day and 1 hour before the start of the first class of each show day until an hour after the end of the last class on show days. The office is located in front of barn 4 or in between barn 1 and the warm up ring on the jumper ring side.

Please be respectful towards our office staff, any concerns regarding the show should be brought to the attention of the show managers.

Competition numbers:

Every entry must be provided an identification number by the competition organizing committee, which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. **Please be aware that all Hunter competitors are required to wear the back number assigned to them when in the show ring. Bridle Numbers are no longer acceptable in the Hunter ring.**

Stabling:

Please clearly mark on your entry form with whom you would like to be stabled. Horses not staying for The Heart of the Continent may not be stabled together due to logistics for the 2 shows. The show committee makes every effort to assign the requested stabling and regrets that any changes made after the closing date may not be able to be accommodated.

Tack stalls can be split between multiple horse accounts, but spits must be made by Friday 5 pm at the show office.

Early arrivals are not permitted without prior approval from the show managers (out of province competitors, please contact the show manager if you wish to arrive at Wednesday evening).

Arrivals before 11am on the warm up day may not be able to be accommodated.

Please Note: There is no added charge for those wishing to stay over between The Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby & The Heart of the Continent. However, there will be no jumping allowed if stewards or medics are not present. Please indicate if you are planning on staying for The Heart of the Continent.

Bedding:

Ordered shavings will be delivered per stable/trainer and a shavings order list per competitor will be attached. Please be respectful and only take what you have ordered and don't take shavings from a different barn! If you forgot to order your shavings please ask the show committee. Ordered shavings will put on to your horse account.

Parking:

The stabling area is closed to vehicle traffic from the first show day till noon Sunday. (Exceptions will be made for handicapped parking. Please ask the office for a permission parking pass or use your handicap parking pass) Please plan your arrivals/ departures accordingly.

All trailers must park at the south side of the jumper ring or the grass area by the barn area. All cars and vehicles must park in the parking lot on the west side of the jumper ring. Please don't block the entry ways to the barns as they need to be accessible for emergency vehicles.

There is RV parking on-site **no cars** driving through the RV parking lot.

There is a 10km/hour speed limit on the show grounds. Failure to abide may result in fines. **HORSES HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY AT ALL TIMES.**

RV camping:

If you are planning on camping in your RV please make sure to book a spot (\$75.00) and send your inquiry to our show secretary Teri Gudmundson:

mhjaentries@gmail.com. Competitors staying with their RV between The Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby and the Heart of the Continent will be charged \$50 for staying in between the two shows. This charge will be added to the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby invoice.

Training and Warm up:

Warm ups for Hunters: 2-7pm Thursday and a half hour before the first class of each show day. Jumping during warm up is allowed, but time might be restricted. Please be respectful to other competitors. 6 Horses allowed in the ring at the same time.

Jumpers schooling rounds on Thursday 2-7pm.

Schooling is only permitted in designated areas and at designated times.

No jumping allowed without a medic on site. The medics will be at the showgrounds a half hour before warm ups on the warm up day and a half hour before the start of the classes on the show days.

The steward or show committee reserves the right to limit the number of horses in the warm up ring and holding areas.

Lunging is only permitted in the warm up ring or designated grass area on the North side of the stabling area. No lunging in the warm up ring when there are other competitors riding their horses. Competitors riding a horse will have the right to enter the warm up ring and the horses that are being lunged need to leave the warm up area immediately, no exemptions will be made.

Smoking:

There is no smoking or vaping allowed in the barn area and within 15 feet of any entrance thereof. Any person caught smoking in the barn area or within 15 feet from the barn will be assessed a fine of \$100, applied to the horse's account. Further offences may result in being asked to leave the show grounds and a forfeiture of showfees paid. The use of cannabis (including but not limited to smoking) is strictly prohibited on the show grounds. Violators may be fined and/or asked to leave the property.

Dogs:

Pets must be on a leash at all times while on the show grounds. Unleashed dogs will be fined with a \$50 fine for every offence, and will be applied to your horse account. Dogs that are aggressive or vicious will be banned from the grounds. Dogs are not permitted in the warm up ring.

Biosecurity:

All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, +21 days, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds), as well as a negative Coggins test within the last 12 months.

Horses exhibiting any signs of illness are not permitted on the grounds.

Please let the show managers know if your horse develops a fever during the show, so preventative measurements can be taken if needed.

Horses missing valid vaccinations/coggins will not be permitted (unless you have a signed vet letter that the horse can't be vaccinated) on the grounds and entries are not eligible for a refund of fees.

All horses being brought on the grounds must not have been in contact with any horses exhibiting any signs of illness for the last 14 days. Horses are not permitted to come on to the grounds if they are stabled at a facility where any horses have been at a venue with a confirmed case of EHV (neurologic or non-neurologic) or any other transmissible disease/illness within the last 21 days.

Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact and the use of common feed/water buckets.

Show committee decisions:

It is important to understand that interpretations of existing rules and regulations and the invoking of additional rules and regulations to cover unforeseen circumstances are the sole responsibility and authority of the show committee. All owners, trainers, competitors and grooms agree to the acceptance of interpretations and additional rulings by virtue of your signed entry.

It is the objective of the show committee to run the show on the highest possible level of sportsmanship. Judges, course designers, and officials have been selected based on their knowledge and experience and their decisions in the competitions are their own responsibility. The show committee accepts no responsibility for their decisions.

Excusing or disqualifying:

Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials or staff shall, at the determination of the show committee, result in disqualification. Such unacceptable behaviour will result in forfeiture of show fees paid and prize money, and acceptance in future shows will be determined by the show committee.

The show committee reserves the right to remove any groom, trainer, rider, parent, manager or owner or all of a related group from the show without being liable for compensation.

Inhumane treatment of any horse on the grounds is forbidden; if a violation occurs the show committee has the right to disqualify the competitor from the show. Such unacceptable treatment will result in forfeiture of show fees paid and prize money, and acceptance in future show will be determined by the show committee. Refer to Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse, F.E.I. Nov. 1990.

In the case of a disqualification of a horse or horses, the winner of the next succeeding prize shall take the prize that had been awarded to the disqualified horse(s) and the other prizes will be adjusted accordingly.

Show ring conduct:

1. No persons other than the officials or staff on duty may enter the competitive ring without the permission of the show manager or the show committee.
2. Saluting protocol: Please stay alert to the gate person's instructions on where to salute once in the ring.
3. The show committee may determine to preload or not preload at any time during the competition.
4. Competitors are only allowed in the show ring when competing or when the course is clearly marked 'OPEN'.
5. The show committee reserves the right to limit the number of horses in the warm up ring.
6. You must be on foot when leading a horse.

Order of go:

The order of go will be drawn.

Special or unforeseen circumstances will be dealt with by the show committee and officials on a case-by-case basis. Please refer to F.E.I Article 245.5. regarding two horses in a jump-off. Any competitor not ready to enter the show ring when called will be eliminated. Fees will not be refunded in case of missed classes.

Liability:

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Neither the Red River Exhibition nor the show committee, nor any of its staff or agents shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen, from any cause or circumstances whatsoever, to exhibitors, competitors or members of their family or their agents or to any one on the show grounds or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on the show grounds or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the show or any journey to or from the show.

It is to be understood and agreed that under no circumstances shall the show committee, its owners, agents, employees, or family be liable for any loss, damages, claims or costs occasioned or suffered by any exhibitor, competitor, members of their family, or their agents, directly or indirectly, howsoever arising, including without limitation, losses, damages, claims or costs as a result of the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby, its owners, agents or employees negligence, and you agree to indemnify and save harmless the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby, its owners, agents and employees from and against any and all liability arising out of any such loss, damages, claims or costs.

Completion of entry form:

Your Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby waiver must be signed, before riding any horse! If you are a minor, your parent or legal guardian must sign. Trainer signatures are not acceptable. Persons responsible must be over 18 and attending the show.

Your entry must include the following:

- **Payment: please pay by Canadian cheque made payable to Marcy Schweizer Memorial Fund, e-transfer to: 204-771-4010, or use the Credit Card option in Show Ground Live.**
- **Horse name on entry must match the horse name listed on any official documents. No horse listed as 'Entry' will be accepted.**
- **Proof of your horse's Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months + 21 days, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds), as well as a negative Coggins test within the last 6 months. The name on the vaccinations/Coggins MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable.**
- **All competitors/owners/coaches/persons responsible must provide proof of their current memberships with their entry form. Riders will not be permitted to compete without proof of current memberships.**

Entries closing date:

Entries will close at midnight July 3th, 2026 unless stalls are sold out before the closing date.

Time schedules:

Tentative schedules will be available at the show office and will be posted true out the showgrounds. Please note that start times may change depending on weather and will be announced during the riders meeting.

Entry fees and starting:

1. You may add or withdraw from a class by the night before the start of the class. Classes after this time will not be refunded unless a vet note is provided.
2. Late adds may not be able to be accommodated. A \$25 late fee will be added for the classes added after the cut off time.
3. Hors concours entries are permitted in the jumper ring only, but the horse will be not allowed to return in the ring at the same day.

Request to add on a EC rated class:

Competitors who would like to qualify for the Royal Toronto Winter Fair can request to add on an EC-rated class not mentioned in this prizelist. An exception is the EC CET medal and the Jump Canada medal, as these classes need to be previously approved by EC. The deadline for this request is a week before the show starts, so we can adjust our schedule accordingly and give other competitors enough notice that this class will be added. These classes will have no prize money, but we will provide ribbons till 6th place.

Prizes:

All prize money will be applied to the horse's account. Any credits after the show will be printed on a cheque.
