## EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES



Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All persons are committed to:

Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;

Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;

Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;

- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

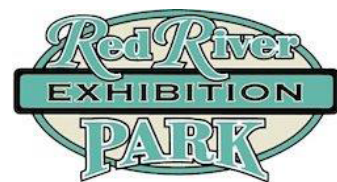

## MHJA RULES & REGULATIONS

### MEMBERSHIPS

For insurance purposes, all riders and owners must have a current Manitoba Horse Council (MHC) membership or membership with their own provincial equestrian federation if out of province.

In order to compete at an MHJA show, both the owner and rider of each horse must be a member of both the MHJA and MHC. Proof of membership is required for: EC Sport License with Amateur status for all Gold, Silver and Bronze shows; and MHC and MHJA for ALL shows.

Non-members may pay a \$65 Temporary MHC membership fee per competition/event; this is for Liability insurance coverage only and no other MHC benefits apply.

### TEMPORARY MEMBERSHIPS AND RECIPROCITY AGREEMENTS

Non-members who are residents of Manitoba must purchase a sixty-five dollar (\$65) temporary membership fee in order to show at MHJA events. Only one temporary membership may be taken out per year. Competitors from outside the province who wish to be eligible for year end points must purchase a membership and compete at a minimum of 3 MHJA shows in that season.

*Dressage Winnipeg & Manitoba Horse Trials memberships are accepted at Summer Out of the City & Fall Harvest in lieu of MHJA non-member fee.*

### AMATEUR STATUS

**Proof Of Amateur Status:** see Article A902

Proof of Amateur Status is required by Competitors in the following classes:

- Adult Amateur Hunter, Junior/Amateur ("Jr/Am") and all other
- Amateur classes.

### HORSE RECORDINGS

Entries must have a valid Equestrian Canada horse recording in order to compete. (See rules of Equestrian Canada, A602.4) If a horse is owned by a temporary competitive license holder, a temporary horse registration must also be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign owned horses are not required to have an EC Horse Recording for show entry but are required

to complete a *Foreign Exhibitors Affidavit of Eligibility* at the Show Office.

USEF members may compete on the reciprocity agreement, but proof of USEF membership and horse registrations must be provided to the show office BEFORE the start of the show.

**EXEMPTIONS** to the horse recording rule (A404) are as follows:

A Horse Recording is not required for horses:

- Competing only in the hack division.
- Competing only in Leadline Classes.
- Competing only in bronze level classes (see specifications below).

### HOW TO ENTER SHOWS

Go to [www.horseshowtime.com](http://www.horseshowtime.com) and choose the show you are entering. Fill out the appropriate blanks for Horse, owner, rider and include all relevant membership numbers. Fill out your trainer, stable/barn, payee information and all addresses required. Complete Rider One information and then click on class numbers, *not divisions*, for that rider. If the horse has two riders, then complete Rider Two after Rider One.

All fees for the show will be listed but do not need to be paid at this time. Click "Submit my Entry" and it will be sent to the show secretary.

Competitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the preparation of their entry forms. Please ensure that you have not cross-entered in sections where cross-entries are not allowed according to the conditions laid out in this prize list.

### WAIVER

An MHJA Waiver must be filled out by each competitor every year. Signatures on the waiver are mandatory. Only one waiver needs to be filled out for the entire season.

### PAYMENTS

All fees are to be paid in Canadian Funds via cheque (drawn on a Canadian bank account) made payable to Manitoba Hunter Jumper Association or by e-transfer to [mhjaetransfer@gmail.com](mailto:mhjaetransfer@gmail.com). Fees may also be paid by Visa or MasterCard (a 3.5% service fee applies). Post-dated cheques and cheques with "pay in Canadian funds"



written on them **will not be accepted**. A \$35 fee will be charged for NSF cheques & after 2 NSF cheques only CASH will be accepted.

### ENTRY DEADLINE

Entries must be submitted by midnight of each show's entry deadline.

**A \$25 late fee will apply to entries received after the closing date.**

Entries will be dated when received by the show secretary. Entries are ONLY MADE VALID when so dated and the Secretary's date is final in determining whether an entry has been received on time. Stabling reservations by phone are only accepted with credit card confirmation.

**If the minimum number of entries are not received by the closing date, we reserve the right to cancel the show. If this decision is made, it will be communicated to the membership no later than 6 days before the scheduled show.**

### COACH/TRAINER INFORMATION

Manitoba Horse Council collects a \$5 levy from all Manitoba entries without named coaches possessing NCCP numbers. Manitoba coaches should know that it is easy to obtain the NCCP number. Many online programs, such as the Minimum Coaching Standard Module of Making Ethical Decisions, give a pathway to obtain the NCCP number. Questions regarding how to obtain the NCCP number should be directed to the MHC office, coaching committee, nccp.ca or Sport Manitoba. All trainers/coaches must carry the memberships and Sports License equivalent to the level of competition where they are training/coaching. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

### \*\*\*NEW FOR 2023\*\*\*

**PLEASE NOTE: Equestrian Canada has implemented a mandatory coach licensing program. All coaches at EC sanctioned events must hold Registered or Licensed Coach Status with EC. All coaches will be required to provide proof of EC Coach Status prior to coaching at any EC Sanctioned events. For more information, please see:**

### PERSON RESPONSIBLE

All entry forms completed must be signed by a PERSON RESPONSIBLE for the horse and rider. Anyone signing the entry form as the Person Responsible must also carry full memberships as outlined above, including the level of sport license applicable to that show.

### NOMINATION & START FEES

Any competitor may nominate any horse by name for any competition or division by paying the entry or nomination fees. NOMINATION FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE. The horse and/or rider can compete as per the regulations set out in each section. *Please note: the computer automatically enters you in the class when the nomination fee is entered. Please notify the show office prior to 5:00pm the day before the class is held if you are not starting.*

Horses not nominated in sections requiring nomination may do so after the start of the show by paying double the nomination fee.

### CHANGE OF ENTRIES

Jumpers may enter by class but a \$5 fee will be charged if the changes are not made by the night before. Same-day entry of any of the Schooling Hunter Classes will result in a \$5 fee.

### CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES

The Office fee, Stabling/Tack Stall fees & Nomination fees (where applicable) are non-refundable. If a class does not fill and is cancelled, the show secretary shall notify the exhibitors at earliest possible opportunity. No class will be cancelled if it has 5 or more entries. A competition may, at its discretion, hold a class with fewer than 5 entries.

Competitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date but before the first class of the show, who provide a certificate of

disability from a veterinarian, will forfeit the Office, Nomination and stall fees. The stall(s) will revert to the show for reassignment.

Competitors cancelling their entries after the start of the show, regardless of reason, will NOT receive a refund.

Note: Competitors are asked to advise the show office and in-gates immediately when they are scratching from an event or from the remainder of the competition.

Substitution of horses is permitted if the show secretary is notified prior to the start of the show. If a substitution is made after the start of the show, a \$25.00 fee will apply.

### SITE DEVELOPMENT FEE (MHC Equestrian Centre)

There is a site development fee of \$3 per horse that goes towards maintaining and upgrading the facility.

### MEDICATION CONTROL (DRUG TESTING)

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in an EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)

### DRUG FEES

All horses are assessed a horse/pony drug fee and are subject to drug testing. Any horse entered in any class at a competition is required to pay drug testing fees while on the competition grounds, and on the recommendation of the Chair of the Provincial Equine Medication Control committee or the Chair's appointee, may be selected for equine medication control testing (see EC Rule Article A 1006). All owners agree that by making their entry, they will allow their horses to be tested. A fee of \$4.00/horse will be submitted at Bronze competitions and \$8.00/horse at the Silver and Gold competitions.

## GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

### SHOW OFFICE

The Show Office will open at approximately 12:00 pm on arrival day and approximately one hour before classes start each day, and closes at 5:00 pm unless otherwise posted.

### COMPETITORS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE THEIR OWN NUMBERS

#### \*\*\*NEW FOR 2023\*\*\*

Every entry will be assigned an identification number by the competition organizing committee. Numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling, exercise and practice areas as well as in the competition rings. (Rule A.814) Please put numbers on before entering the warm up areas. Each horse uses the same number each time it enters the ring, including equitation classes. Back Numbers will be provided by the show office. You must keep your number for the duration of the 2023 show season. Availability of replacement numbers is not guaranteed and will be provided at a cost of \$25.00 where available.

### STABLING

Priority for stabling will be given to horses entered for the entire show. Please name the barn/coach with whom you wish to be stabled. Management will try to honor all written requests for stabling together. An emergency contact & phone number MUST be displayed on stall doors. Stalls must be thoroughly cleaned and sufficiently bedded daily by 10:00 am. All refuse must be placed in designated areas. Aisles must be kept clean. Individual competitors will be responsible for any extra cost resulting from excessive damage to stalls and any damage must be reported to the Show Office. Excessive amounts of shavings left in the stall at the end of the show will result in additional clean out charges.

### TACK STALLS

Priority will be given to large groups if space becomes limited.

### UNSTABLED HORSES/DAILY SHIP-INS (MHC Equestrian Centre)

Unstabled horses are subject to a Grounds Fee of \$10 per day.

### HORSES TIED TO TRAILERS OR STANDING IN TRAILERS MUST ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:

Horses must be supervised at all times and cannot be left unattended. Any concerns on the part of the Competition Organizers and/or Officials must be addressed immediately. The

location for tying will be determined by the Equestrian Centre Manager and may change according to demand. Adequate hay and water must be provided and clean-up of area must occur. During inclement weather, horses need to be provided shelter in a temporary stall (BHP) or an empty stall (RREX) while the weather passes. If no stalls are available, the horse(s) will need to be transported home.

### VET & FARRIER

A Farrier and Vet will be available on an on-call basis. Their Name and Contact Information will be posted in show office.

### FIRST AID

Medics will be in attendance during competition hours and from 2:00-7:00 pm on warm-up day. No jumping will be permitted until the medic is present. Please call 911 in case of emergency at other times if needed.

### ARRIVAL

Horses will be allowed on the showgrounds the morning of, but not prior to, the first day of warm ups. The competition rules are in effect upon arrival of the first horse on the competition grounds. All entries will have stalls assigned prior to arrival. Please check the posted list or show office for stall assignment. Riding is at your own risk and on flat only until the medics are present.

### SCHOOLING

All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. Refer to FEI Rules, Article 201 *Exercise and Schooling Areas and Practice Obstacles*. These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation and jumper classes and divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions.

### PRACTICE AREAS & SCHOOLING

Times, rules and locations for lunging and schooling will be posted. Schooling will only be permitted in designated areas at designated times. All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. **There will be no schooling of any kind if the Steward is not in attendance at the show.** These rules pertain to all Hunter, Equitation and Jumper classes and Divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions.

### SCHOOLING/WARM UP ROUNDS

There is a \$25 Schooling fee for all Hunters & Jumpers entered in each Show. Both rings may be used by any competitor. The number of horses in the schooling rings may be limited if needed.

## PARKING

Designated parking areas for cars, trailers, vans and campers will be enforced. Horse trailers may not be parked in the barn area during the horse show except for immediate loading/unloading.

## PETS

Dogs cannot be loose and must be properly leashed at all times on the show grounds. Dogs are not permitted in the warm up ring or in-gate area. The Show will fine owners \$50 for Dogs not on leashes. For bio security reasons, dogs are not permitted in horse stalls.

## EQUINE BIO-SECURITY AND EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact. Please observe the following bio security protocols:

Limit horse-to-horse contact

1. Limit contact between horses and other horses, humans, and other animals.
2. Restrict unnecessary movement of horses out of their aisle or barn. Do not take a horse to another barn to be tacked up, braided, clipped, etc. Sharing equipment and grooming supplies, or coming into contact with other horses or soiled surfaces can spread germs.
3. Do not lead horses down other tent/barn aisles.
4. Do not let horses make nose-to-nose contact with horses from other barns when in common areas such as wash racks, at the rings, or while grazing.
5. Do not touch, pet, or feed treats to horses from other barns.

Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spread them via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.

Do not let water hoses touch buckets when filling. Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.

Do not allow horses to drink from the hose.

Do not share water or feed buckets.

Use clean brushes and towels on each horse. If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to

wash them often.

Do not share tack and equipment, especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.

Monitor your horses and contact the Show Veterinarian if you notice any unusual symptoms.

## EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

**Coggins:** All horses being brought onto the grounds for any competition must have a current **NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST valid within 12 months.**

**Proof of Vaccination:** You must provide proof of vaccination for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not. A letter from Veterinarian or invoice from veterinarian is satisfactory and should be submitted to show secretary at time of entry. Proof of vaccination must be e-mailed to show secretary at mhjaentires@gmail.com Required Vaccines are: Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months +/- a 30-day grace period. A temperature check should also be done 3 days before the first day of the show. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations

*Keep copies of your Vaccination records in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by show organizers to present your health papers at any time.*

**Ship-Ins/Daily Haul-Ins:** If you ship in and out daily, keep copies of your Vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You will be asked to present these records.

**West Nile:** It is highly recommended that horses are vaccinated for West Nile Virus.

## HUMAN BIO SECURITY GUIDELINES

*All competitors, owners, coaches, volunteers and show personnel are responsible for following Manitoba Health guidelines for physical distancing when on the showgrounds.*

*All attendees to any MHJA show must familiarize themselves with these procedures to help protect their own health, as well as the health of others in our community.*

*All participants should be mindful to frequently wash their hands or use hand sanitizer.*

**PLEASE BE AWARE THAT COVID-19 PROTOCOLS MAY CHANGE. WE WILL ADHERE TO ALL PROVINCIAL ORDERS AND GUIDELINES IN PLACE AT THE TIME OF THE SHOW.**

## STALLIONS

Junior B and C exhibitors may not ride, drive, show on the line or handle stallions on the grounds. Junior A exhibitors may ride manageable stallions in Jumper Classes only. Art G105

## SHOW RULES

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to refuse, limit, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries; disqualify any riders or exhibitors thereby cancelling awarded prizes; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to change rings and/or officials, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors and to intercept all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, any incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Posted notice will be given to all exhibitors in the event of a change in the program.

The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse will not be tolerated. Any unsportsmanlike conduct or use of abusive language by any person towards any other person will not be tolerated. Contemptuous comments and interference towards officials will not be tolerated. No person, other than officials, the Show Committee or Show Management may enter the show ring without the permission of Show Management. Any of the above actions might result in removal from show, forfeiture of prizes and possible exclusion from exhibiting for one or more years.

As per article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition..." (A602.7) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2)

In the interest of the welfare of the horse, competitors may be asked to limit the number of classes for horses that are shown excessively. At Summer out of the City and Jump into Fall, each horse is limited to four (4) over fences classes per day.

## RINGSIDE BEHAVIOUR

It is inappropriate to shout instructions to or critique a rider as they are focusing on their course. Providing some guidance in a normal speaking voice when the rider is near the ingate is acceptable however shouting instructions in a loud manner while the rider is in the ring is very distracting to everyone in the vicinity (including the judge). Please be considerate to everyone at the show and limit ringside coaching to appropriate levels.

## CONCUSSION PROTOCOLS AND RETURN TO PLAY POLICY

All MHJA competitions will adhere to Sport Manitoba/Equestrian Canada 'Return to Play' guidelines when assessing a rider's ability to continue in the competition following a possible head injury. The guidelines & descriptions of concussive head injuries can be found at [www.parachutecanada.org](http://www.parachutecanada.org) & will be posted in the show office at each competition. In conjunction with the onsite medics, the Show Committee will have discretion as to whether a rider will be allowed to continue in the competition following a suspected concussive head injury and will be made solely to prevent any further injury or long-term harm to that rider.

## HORS CONCOURS

Entries will not be accepted in hunters at EC sanctioned shows; Hors Concours rounds may be allowed in the jumper ring at twice the class fee, dependent on entries, at the discretion of the show committee. Horses showing Hors Concours may not compete in that ring again that day over fences.

## PRIZES

Prize winners must take part in the prize giving ceremony and should do so with the placed horses. If a prize winner fails, without plausible excuse, to take part at the prize giving ceremony, the organizing committee, at its discretion, may decide to withhold the prize. (FEI Art. 248.5) Per EC rules, all prize money will be applied against entry fees to the **owner on the entry form** or will be mailed within four weeks of the competition. Competitors must ensure that the correct postal/zip code is included on the entry form or prize money will not be mailed out. Prize cheques must be cashed within three months or prize money will be forfeited. Classes with 4 or more entries will run with prize money as listed in the prize listed. Classes with fewer than 4 entries will be run at the discretion of the Show Committee and entry fee and prize money may be modified.

## CHAMPIONSHIPS

All Hunter, Hack and Jumper divisions with three (3) or more classes may receive Champion and Reserve. Equitation divisions & some Hunter/Jumper divisions will receive High Point awards. Unless otherwise informed, all horses/ponies must be presented in a bridle for their respective award. Championships will usually be presented after the final class in the Division. Failure to present horses may result in forfeiture of prize money. If there is a tie for Championship in the Hunter Divisions, the horse with the most points over fences will break the tie. In Jumper divisions, a coin toss will break the tie. Equitation ties will hack off. Hack ties will be shown in hand and judged on Conformation. Points for division champion will be awarded for all classes listed in the prize list as part of the division.

## TACK AND EQUIPMENT *Jumpers See Article G502*

1. Draw reins must be used in a safe manner. Draw reins are permitted in the schooling area. Draw reins are permitted over fences if used in the following manner:
  - a) Attached to the girth, running through the front legs and secured at the neck
  - b) Attached to the breastplate
  - c) Attached to the girth at the billet straps, or
  - d) Attached to the d-rings at the front of the saddle.

Standing martingales, German martingales and draw reins secured as above will be permitted in jumper classes where the height of the fences does not exceed 1.15m.





Junior, amateur or non-pro riders may not compete in draw reins or German martingales.

2. Restrictive devices such as the de Gogue, chambon, running reins etc. may be used for schooling on the flat but are not permissible over fences, over poles on the ground, or in the competition ring.
3. Sheepskin may be used on each cheek piece of the bridle providing the sheepskin does not exceed 3cm in diameter measured from the horse's face.
4. In the competition arena:
  - a) Blinkers are forbidden.
  - b) If running martingales are used, they must be unrestricted (for use of standing martingales, see Article G502)
  - c) Reins must be attached to the bit(s) or directly to the bridle. Gags and hackamores are allowed in jumper classes in accordance with EC rules.
5. Anywhere on the competition grounds:
  - a) In the interests of safety, the stirrup iron and the stirrup leather (this also applies to safety stirrups) must hang freely from the bar of the saddle and the outside of the flap. There must be no other restrictions or attachments of any kind. The competitor must not directly or indirectly tie any part of his body to the saddlery.
  - b) Competitors are allowed to use a dressage whip when working on the flat but are strictly forbidden to use or carry a whip which is weighed down at the end at any time, or to carry or use one which is more than 75 cm in length in the arena or schooling areas, when riding over poles or over any obstacles. No substitute for a whip may be carried.
6. Running, Irish, bib martingales etc. must be used with rein stops where appropriate.

#### ATTIRE

Riders are to be neatly and suitably attired. White breeches are requested for the Hunter Challenge, Medal Classes and Prix's.

When permitted by the show committee, riders may show in the jumper ring in a solid-coloured collared shirt or an MHJA shirt. Striped or multi-coloured shirts are not permissible – exception Beach Party Show, where rules will be posted. Tank tops are not permitted while riding. At all EC sanctioned competitions, all competitors (including foreign competitors) in EC National classes must wear ASTM /SEI or BSI/BSEN approved helmets, with the safety harness correctly fastened at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.

#### PHOTOGRAPHS

Each exhibitor, or parent/guardian of exhibitors who are minors, agrees that photographs taken of the exhibitor by any photographer approved by the MHJA may be used for promotional purposes by the MHJA or its official sponsors.

#### PROTESTS

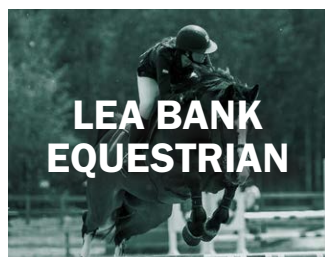
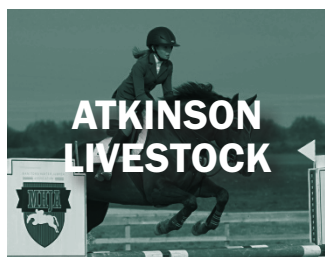
All protests must be made to the MHJA Show Secretary in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash or certified cheque as per EC Rules where applicable. Such protests must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Show Chairperson within 48 hours after the completion of the Class concerned.

#### NON-COMPETING HORSES

MHJA members may bring horses for training on the warm up day only of competitions at either BHP or RRM. There will be no stabling for these horses. Any ring may be used and a fee of \$40 will be assessed. Payment, waiver, and proof of vaccination must be received by close of entries and horses will have a number assigned. These horses are not eligible to enter any classes, but are governed by the Rules of EC and by the rules and regulations of the horse show and are bound by EC drug rules. Both competitive and non-competing horses are subject to drug testing.

#### SHOW COMMITTEE DECISIONS

The Show Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules and to correct any error in the Prize List or Program. All owners, trainers, competitors, and grooms agree to the acceptance of these interpretations and additional ruling by virtue of your signed entry.

## 2023 CLASSES OFFERED

### LEAD LINE SPECIAL CLASS 120

To be held at each rated horse show. The owner and handler of the horse must have current MHJA, MHC and EC membership.

### EC RATED HUNTER CLASSES

#### 3' CHILDRENS HUNTER CLASS 39, 40 O/F, 41 U/S

To be offered at Heart of the Continent. Points to count for MHJA 3' Jr/Am year end awards. No cross-entry for riders into classes higher than 3'5"/1.05m (see EB article G307)

#### 3' ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER CLASS 42, 43 O/F, 44 U/S

To be offered at Heart of the Continent. Points to count for MHJA 3' Jr/Am year end awards. No cross-entry for riders into classes higher than 3'5"/1.05m (see EB article G309)

#### 3'6" OPEN HUNTER CLASS 48, 49 O/F, 50 U/S

Open to all horses and riders. Height 3'6"

### HACK DIVISION

Open to all horses over 14.2 hands. Judged 55% on performance, 20% quality, 15% conformation and 10% manners. Horses must enter the ring at a walk. In the event of a tie for Champion, the horses must be shown in hand & judged on conformation.

#### OPEN ROAD HACK (ARTICLE G1302) CLASS 51, 52

Must present an appearance of overall substance with refinement. Soundness is required and blemishes may be penalized. Horses to be shown at a flat-footed walk with reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. No more than 8 horses will gallop at one time.

#### OPEN SHOW HACK (ARTICLE G1301) CLASS 53, 54

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop; collected and extended gaits to be called for; to stand quietly. No more than 8 horses will gallop at one time.

### SPECIAL HUNTER CLASSES

Please note that special classes, derbies and classics will be offered at selected shows and not at all shows. See each individual show schedule to see which specials are being held at that show. **Please note that for classes 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, and 60, a horse/rider combination may not enter a hunter special at a height lower than the lowest height division they have competed in at that show.**

Exception: Class 61 Sarah Lynn Junior Hunter Special (open to all Junior Riders on horses & ponies)

#### 2'3" HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 55

Entry is separate from the division.

#### 2'6" HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 56

Entry is separate from the division.

#### 2'6" SARAH LYNN JUNIOR HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 61

To be held at Beach Party. 2'6" Hunter Special in memory of Sarah-Lynn vander Zijl. Open to Junior riders on horses & ponies. No height adjustment for ponies.

#### 2'9" HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 57

Entry is separate from the division.

#### 3' HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 58

Entry is separate from the division.

#### 3'3" HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 59

Entry is separate from the division.

#### 3'6" HUNTER SPECIAL CLASS 60

Entry is separate from the division.

#### HUNTER DERBY CLASS 62

To be held at Summer Smiles & Fall Harvest 2023.

The Hunter Derby is a high-performance hunter class which presents competitors with the opportunity to showcase the talents of both horse and rider over a more challenging course. Handiness and the demonstration of inside turns are rewarded with higher points. The Derby combines a Hunter Classic and a Handy Hunter into one round. This format is exciting for both riders and spectators, encouraging riders to lay it on the line with bold, forward riding right from the start. The course may include the banks, grob, hedges and combinations along with traditional hunter fences.

The Hunter Derby will be run as a split height:

For horses competing at 2'9" and lower at the show, the fences will be 2'6" with options up to 2'9".

For horses competing at 3'0" and higher at the show, the fences will be 2'9" with options up to 3'0".

The course will be open for walking prior to the start of the class.

The class is judged as a Handy Hunter, with a score announced immediately after each horse has finished its round. Two bonus points are awarded for each high-performance option taken on course (for example higher or more challenging fences). Additionally, two bonus points are awarded for each handy option taken on course (for example inside turns, halt, trot fence, route taken on roll backs, unique approaches, boldness and an impressionable start etc.) Immediately after the horse on course finishes, the scores will be announced as follows: total for performance, total for more difficult fences taken, total for handiness and a grand total for each horse and rider combination.

There is no jog required for this class.

#### HUNTER EXTRAVAGANZA CLASS 63

To be held at Beach Party 2023.

To be held in the jumper ring and judged as a hunter class. The course will utilize some hunter type fences and some jumper type fences with some options. More details will be posted at the show. One or two judges will score, open scoring. Open to horses and ponies competing in the hunters. Horses and ponies will jump at 2'9" with options up to 3'. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. There will be one round with a minimum of 10 fences. There is no jog required for this class.

#### THE 2'3" CLASSIC CLASS 64

To be held at Heart of the Continent 2023.

Article G315: Open to horses that have shown in at least one hunter division at 2'9" or lower at this competition. **No cross entry into Class 65** (3' Classic).

To be shown over two rounds with the first having 12 or more fences and the second over a shortened course. Each horse is scored numerically and the top 10 scores from the first round will come back in reverse order for the second round. Placings will be based on the combined scores of the two rounds. Points will count towards the 2'3" Open Hunter Year-End Award. The course will be open for walking prior to the class. The owner of the winning horse will be expected in the ring for presentation. Awards to 8th place.

#### THE 3' OPEN CLASSIC CLASS 65

To be held at Heart of the Continent 2023.

Article G315: Open to horses that have shown in at least one hunter division at this competition. **No cross entry into Class 64** (2'3" Classic).

To be shown over two rounds with the first having 12 or more fences and the second over a shortened course. Each horse is scored numerically and the top 10 scores from the first round will come back in reverse order for the second round. Placings will be based on the combined scores of the two rounds.

Points will count towards the 3' Open Hunter Year-End Award. The course will be open for walking prior to the class. The owner of the winning horse will be expected in the ring for presentation. Awards to 8th place.





## EQUITATION

The age of a rider on January 1st will be maintained throughout the competition year, which runs from January 1st to December 31st. Riders born on January 1st will assume the lesser age on that date. See Art G1006. Junior equitation has been changed for 2023, see below.

### MHJA Junior Equitation

Open to all junior riders. No adjustment for ponies.

**Over Fences 2'6"** Class 66

**On the Flat** Class 67

**MEDALS** Refer to EC specifications for Jump Canada Medal.

### MHJA ADULT AMATEUR MEDAL CLASS 68

Open to Adult Amateurs but no cross entry into the Jack Benny Medal. Competitors are required to jump a course of no less than 8 jumps at 2'9" max. Top 8 riders will return to work on the flat.

### MHJA JACK BENNY MEDAL CLASS 69

Open to Adult Amateurs who are 35 years of age and over as of January 1st, 2022. Competitors are required to jump a course of no less than 8 jumps at 2'3" max. Riders are restricted to classes under 3' at the same show. Not open to Coaches/Trainers/Non-Pros. The top 8 riders will return to work on the flat.

### MHJA JUNIOR MEDAL CLASS 70

To be held at Beach Party & Heart. Open to all Junior Riders. Competitors will be required to jump a course of no less than 8 jumps at 2'6". There will be no adjustments for ponies. The top 8 riders will return to work on the flat.

### 2'3" TRUE NORTH MEDAL CLASS 71

See specifications for Jump Canada medal. Open to Juniors and Amateur Riders. Proof of Amateur Status required. Riders

will compete in an o/f round over hunter-type fences followed by a flat phase. Top 8 competitors will be asked to return for the flat portion. Top 4 competitors will be required to answer a horsemanship question by the judge following the flat phase. A year-end prize will be presented to the finalist with the most points. No cross-entry into classes higher than 2'6" at the same show.

### SPIRIT OF THE PAN AM MEDAL 0.90M CLASS 72

To run at Beach Party, Marcy Schweizer Derby, & Heart of the Continent.

The class will be run in accordance with EC Mini Medal Rules\*.

Article G1107 CET Mini Medal Class Specifications:

The CET Mini Medal Class (Pan Am Mini Medal) is to be held under the same rules and regulations as the CET Medal (See G1109) with the exception of the following: There is no age limit for this class. Senior riders must be amateurs as per current EC rules.

Jumping Phase Maximum 0.90m

Gymnastic Phase Maximum 0.90m

There will be no water jump, but a liverpool is mandatory.

Eligibility:

Riders competing in 1.20m Jumper Divisions or higher are not eligible.

Riders may not cross-enter between the Mini Medal and the CET Medal at the same competition.

Riders may qualify for both CET Mini Medal (Pan Am Mini Medal) and the CET Medal Finals, but may compete in only one Regional Final. Trainers may walk both the gymnastic course and the jumping course with riders. Course designers must have at least EC recorded status.

There will be three phases in the final: Flat Phase, Gymnastic Phase, and Jumping Phase. Flat Phase will be a simplified version of the CET Medal flat test (test may be read). There will be a Final Phase. The judge will ask for individual testing of the top four competitors on their own horses. The competitors in the Final Phase will not switch horses. Minimum 6 horses required.

## MISCELLANEOUS HUNTER CLASSES (NOT EC RATED)

### JR/AM CROSSRAIL HUNTER CLASS 1, 2, 3 O/F, 4 U/S

No cross-entry for riders except into Jr/Am 2' Hunter, Hack Division, and Junior Equitation on the flat.

### JR/AM 2' HUNTER CLASS 5, 6, 7 O/F, 8 U/S

No cross-entry for riders except into Jr/Am Crossrail Hunter, Hack Division, and Junior Equitation on the flat.

### OPEN 2'3" HUNTER CLASS 9, 10 O/F, 11 U/S

No combinations. Open to all horses, ponies and riders.

### STARTER HUNTER CLASS 12, 13 O/F, 14 U/S

Intended for a beginner horse, pony or rider in their first year of showing over fences. Eligibility for this division is based upon the horse/pony or rider, one of whom must be in their first year of showing over fences. This combination is eligible for one calendar year (Jan-Dec).

### JACK BENNY HUNTER CLASS 15, 16 O/F, 17 U/S

Open to adult amateur riders 35 years of age or older as of January 1st 2022. Riders are restricted to classes under 3' at the same show. Not open to coaches/trainers/professionals.

### MHJA PONY HUNTER CLASS 18, 19 O/F, 20 U/S

No jog. Open to all ponies ridden by juniors. Junior B & C riders may ride small, medium and large ponies. Junior A riders may only ride large ponies. Ponies to be shown over the same course at the following height. Jumps shall be raised & adjusted to the respective heights & spreads.

**Large Ponies:** 13.3 - 14.2hh 2'6"

**Medium Ponies:** 12.2 - 13.2hh 2'6"

**Small Ponies:** Under 12.2hh 2'3"

### OPEN 2'6" HUNTER CLASS 21, 22 O/F, 23 U/S

No combinations. Open to all horses, ponies and riders.

### 2'6" JR/AM HUNTER CLASS 24, 25 O/F, 26 U/S

No combinations. Open to all horses & ponies ridden by a Junior or Amateur only. Proof of EC Amateur Status Required.

### OPEN 2'9" HUNTER CLASS 27, 28 O/F, 29 U/S

Open to all horses, ponies and riders.

### 2'9" JR/AM HUNTER CLASS 30, 31 O/F, 32 U/S

Open to all horses & ponies ridden by a Junior or Amateur only. Proof of EC Amateur Status Required

### OPEN 3'0" HUNTER CLASS 33, 34 O/F, 35 U/S

Open to all horses and riders.

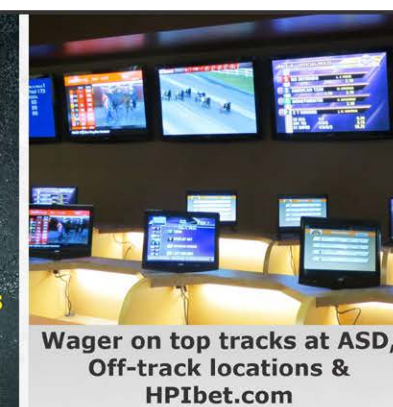
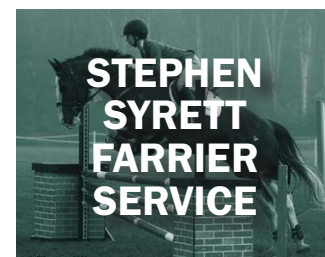
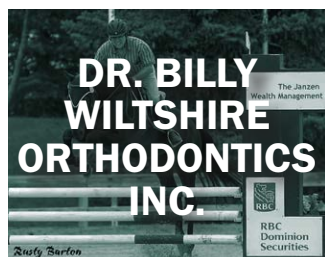

Open to junior and amateur riders only.

Open to all horses and riders. Height 3'3"

## JUMPER DIVISIONS

Entries for jumper classes should be made by the class, not by the division.  
For prize money, please refer to the individual show.

Jumper classes will be run according to a set order of go. The order may be changed in exceptional circumstances only, such as one rider showing multiple horses in the same class. (Article G706: a minimum of 10 horses to go in between each horse ridden by the same rider)

The jumper ring will have scheduling priority and conflicts in the Hunter Ring will not be considered sufficient to change the jumper Order of Go in the Jumper Ring.

There will be only one course walk for the 'JA' & 'Open' divisions of

the 0.85m, 0.90m and 1.0m jumper classes; these will run as one class with two separate cards.

A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement, but downward movement is restricted to only one level and is based on the level of the first class in which they have competed at that show.

Post entries: In classes where post or late entries are permitted and accepted after the draw is made, the post/late entry shall go first in the Order of Go.

**Schooling Rules for Hunter, Equitation and Jumpers:**  
All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules.  
Refer to Chapter 8, FEI Rules

### 0.85M JR/AM JUMPER SCORING: G613.1 MATCH THE CLOCK CLASS 82, 83, 84

Open to horses & ponies ridden by Junior & Amateur riders only, with no adjustments for ponies. Competitors with equal faults will be placed according to how close their time is to the optimum time, which is based on the course being ridden at the posted speed. Proof of Amateur Status is required.

### 0.90M OPEN JUMPER CLASS 85, 86, 87

Open to all horses, ponies and riders with no adjustments for ponies.

### 0.90M JR/AM JUMPER CLASS 88, 89, 90

Open to horses & ponies ridden by Junior or Amateur rider only with no adjustments for ponies. Proof of Amateur Status is required.

## EC RATED JUMPER DIVISIONS

### 1.0M OPEN JUMPER CLASS 91, 92, 93

Open to all horses, ponies and riders with no adjustments for ponies.

### 1.0M JR/AM JUMPER CLASS 94, 95, 96

Open to all horses & ponies ridden by a Junior or Amateur only with no adjustments for ponies. Proof of Amateur Status is required.

### 1.10M JUMPER CLASS 97, 98, 99

Open to all horses and riders.

### 1.15M JUMPER CLASS 100, 101, 102

Open to all horses and riders.

### 1.20M JUMPER CLASS 103, 104, 105

To be combined with 1.30m jumpers unless 6 or more entries at each height

Open to all horses and riders. See also: Jumper Derby

### 1.30M JUMPER CLASS 106, 107, 108

To be combined with 1.20m jumpers unless 6 or more entries at each height

Open to all horses and riders.

### 1.40M JUMPER

Will be added to the schedule by request

Open to all horses and riders.

## SPECIAL JUMPER CLASSES

### JUMPER DERBY (not EC rated)

Scoring: Table C Article 277

To be held at Summer Smiles and Fall Harvest.

Open to all horse and rider combinations. Course will be 14-16 obstacles, using the entire Grand Prix field & may include the bank, ditch, water jumps, liverpool, hedges and other natural obstacles.

### 0.90M DERBY CLASS 109

Open to horse/rider combinations that have shown to a maximum height of 1.0m at the show. Counts toward champion in 0.90m open jumper division.

### 1.10M DERBY CLASS 110

Open to horse/rider combinations that have shown to a maximum height of 1.15m at the show. Counts toward champion in 1.10m open division.

### 1.20M DERBY CLASS 111

Open to horse/rider combinations that have shown at 1.20m and higher at the show. Counts toward champion in 1.20m jumper division.

Jumper Classics to be held at Beach Party & Heart of the Continent:

### 0.85M MINI PRIX TABLE A ARTICLE 238.2. CLASS 112

Open to all horse rider combinations who have competed in at least one 0.85m jumper class at the same show. No cross entry into higher divisions.

This class will consist of one round plus a jump off.

Max height 0.90 m.

### 0.90M MINI PRIX TABLE A ARTICLE 238.2. CLASS 113

Open to all horse rider combinations who have competed in at least one 0.90m jumper class at the same show. No cross entry into higher divisions.

This class will consist of one round plus a jump off.

Max height 0.90 m.

### 1.0M MINI PRIX TABLE A ARTICLE 238.2 CLASS 114

Open to all horse rider combinations who have competed in at least one 1.0m jumper class at the same show. No cross entry into higher divisions.

This class will consist of one round plus a jump off.

Max height 1.0m.



### 1.10M PRIX TABLE A ARTICLE 238.2. CLASS 115

Open to all horse rider combinations who have competed in at least one 1.10m class at the same show. No cross entry into higher divisions. This class will consist of a first round plus a jump off.

Max height 1.10 m.

### 1.15M PRIX TABLE A ARTICLE 238.2 (HEART OF THE CONTINENT) CLASS 116

Open to all horse rider combinations who have competed in at least one 1.15m class at the same show. This class will have one round plus a jump off.

Max Height 1.15m

### 1.0-1.10m ACCUMULATOR CLASS FEI ARTICLE 269.1 Class 117

To be held at Beach Party

This class takes place over 6, 8 or 10 obstacles with increasing difficulty. Combinations are not allowed. The increasing difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles, but also due to the difficulty of the track. Bonus points are awarded as follows: 1 point for obstacle No. 1 not knocked down, 2 points for No. 2, 3 points for No. 3, etc. with a total of 21, 36, or 55 points. No point is awarded for an obstacle that is knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalized according to Table A scoring.

This competition will take place with the first round against the clock, without a jump-off. For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one element may be designated The Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle, and carries double points. If the Joker is knocked down, these points must be deducted from the total points obtained thus far by the Athlete. The Joker will be 1.20m.

A cooler will be presented to the winner.
