Ec Rules and regulations

General rules & regulations:

The Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby is sanctioned as a: Silver competition member of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. If there is a discrepancy between the rules listed in this section and the 2025 rules, the 2025 rules will take precedence.

General:

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle:

EC requires adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

- a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to maltreatment;
- c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Sport Licenses:

Riders and owners must have a minimum Silver EC sport license to be eligible to compete at the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby. An EC Sport License is required for residents of Canada who are competitors, owners or lessees, and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry in EC sanctioned competitions.

Horse recording:

All Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404).

Coaches:

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. Coach status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC competitions.

Birth date:

Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year, are classified as juniors. All Juniors must state their birth date on the entry form, and birth certificates are to be made available upon request.

Order of go:

The order of go will be drawn.

Special or unforeseen circumstances will be dealt with by the show committee and officials on a case-by-case basis. Please refer to F.E.I Article 245.5. regarding two horses in a jump-off. Any competitor not ready to enter the show ring when called will be eliminated. Fees will not be refunded in case of missed classes.

Helmets:

It is mandatory that all persons mounted on a horse anywhere on the show grounds wear protective headgear secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet. Please refer to Article G102 of the 2017 Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section G Hunter, Jumper.

Junior competitors:

All Junior competitors are subject to the Junior Headgear Rule (A905) "Classes with JA attached are restricted to Junior and Amateur riders.

Medication control:

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.

Vaccinations:

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. All horses must also meet the health and biosecurity requirements set out in this prize list.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

\$150.00 SCHOLARSHIPS EXCLUSIVE TO ROYAL MANITOBA WINTER FAIR & HEART OF THE CONTINENT:

- An unlimited number of scholarships will be awarded to riders who compete in two out of the following three classes: CET Medal at RMWF (MB), Eclipse Medal 1.10m at Bow Valley Classic I (AB), OR the CET Medal at the Heart of The Continent (MB) subject to the rider's combined score in two classes being 156/200 or higher.
- An unlimited number of Scholarships will also be awarded to riders who compete in two out of the three medal classes: CET Mini Medal at RMWF (MB), Eclipse Medal 1.00m at Bow Valley Classic I (AB), OR the CET Mini Medal at Heart of the Continent (MB) subject to the rider's combined score in two classes being 156/200 or higher.
- In the event no riders score 156 or higher, no Scholarship will be awarded

BEACH PARTY, DERBY, AND HEART OF THE CONTINENT 2'6", 2'9" AND SPIRIT OF PAN-AM SCHOLARSHIPS EXCLUSIVE TO MANITOBA SUMMER TOURNAMENTS:

- Riders will select which Medal height to compete in at the Summer tournaments. Riders must show at a minimum of 2 out of 3 Summer shows at their selected height to be eligible for scholarships.
- If the rider achieves a combined score from two shows that matches or exceeds 156/200, a \$150.00 scholarship will be awarded. If a rider competes at all three shows, their top two scores will be used.
- Three "Persistence and Perseverance" Bursaries of \$100 will be awarded, one at each Medal height to the rider achieving the highest accumulated score during the Summer shows, regardless of the number of shows or Medal heights competed in.

\$100.00 BURSARY TO WINNER OF "MY FIRST MEDAL" AT ROYAL MANITOBA WINTER FAIR:

This Bursary is to reward a rider's first success in a medal class regardless of the score achieved.

\$5,000 JULIA BOSTOCK COACH'S AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

The winning coach (domiciled in the Prairie Region) will be determined by the number of wins recorded by their pupils in Medal classes scheduled in Alberta (149), Saskatchewan (24), and Manitoba (27). A total of 200 medal classes are scheduled for 2025. To be presented at Royal West.

\$15,000 BARBARA ANDERSON TEAM EQUITATION CHALLENGE

The MHJA is invited to select a team of three riders domiciled in Manitoba to compete in the Barbara Anderson Team Equitation Challenge at Royal West. The team shall include a Professional rider, and two Junior/Amateurs. The gymnastic course will be set with a maximum fence height of 1.00m. The team entry fee of \$450.00 will be complimentary.

Show Jumping Canada is proud to reward Manitoba's coaching fraternity and young riders for their achievements in medal competition during the 2025 show season!

General information

Office hours:

The office is open from 12:00 p.m.–7:00 p.m. on the warm up day and 1 hour before the start of the first class of each show day until an hour after the end of the last class on show days. The office is located in front of barn 4.

Please be respectful towards our office staff, any concerns regarding the show should be brought to the attention of the show managers.

Parking:

The stabling area is closed to vehicle traffic from the first show day till noon Sunday. (Exceptions will be made for handicapped parking. Please ask the office for a permission parking pass or use your handicap parking pass) Please plan your arrivals/ departures accordingly.

All trailers must park at the south side of the jumper ring or the grass area by the barn area. All cars and vehicles must park in the parking lot on the west side of the jumper ring. Please don't block the entry ways to the barns as they need to be accessible for emergency vehicles.

There is RV parking on-site **no cars** driving through the RV parking lot.

There is a 10km/hour speed limit on the show grounds. Failure to abide may result in fines. **HORSES HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY AT ALL TIMES.**

RV camping:

If you are planning on camping in your RV please make sure to book a spot and send your inquiry to our show secretary Lauren Perry: mhjaentries@gmail.com

Smoking:

There is no smoking or vaping allowed in the barn area and within 15 feet of any entrance thereof. Any person caught smoking in the barn area or within 15 feet from the barn will be assessed a fine of \$100, applied to the horse's account. Further offences may result in being asked to leave the show grounds and a forfeiture of showfees paid.

The use of cannabis (including but not limited to smoking) is strictly prohibited on the show grounds. Violators may be fined and/or asked to leave the property.

Biosecurity:

All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, +21 days, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds), as well as a negative Coggins test within the last 12 months.

Horses exhibiting any signs of illness are not permitted on the grounds.

Please let the show managers know if your horse develops a fever during the show, so preventative measurements can be taken if needed.

Horses missing valid vaccinations/coggins will not be permitted (unless you have a signed vet letter that the horse can't be vaccinated) on the grounds and entries are not eligible for a refund of fees.

All horses being brought on the grounds must not have been in contact with any horses exhibiting any signs of illness for the last 14 days. Horses are not permitted to come on to the grounds if they are stabled at a facility where any horses have been at a venue with a confirmed case of EHV (neurologic or non-neurologic) or any other transmissible disease/illness within the last 21 days.

Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact and the use of common feed/water buckets.

Dogs:

Pets must be on a leash at all times while on the show grounds. Unleashed dogs will be fined with a \$50 fine for every offence, and will be applied to your horse account. Dogs that are aggressive or vicious will be banned from the grounds. Dogs are not permitted in the warm up ring.

Stabling:

Please clearly mark on your entry form with whom you would like to be stabled. Horses not staying for The Heart of the Continent may not be stabled together due to logistics for the 2 shows. The show committee makes every effort to assign the requested stabling and regrets that any changes made after the closing date may not be able to be accommodated.

Tack stalls can be split between multiple horse accounts, but spits must be made by Friday 5 pm at the show office.

Early arrivals are not permitted without prior approval from the show managers (out of province competitors please contact the show manager if you wish to arrive at Wednesday evening).

Arrivals before 11am on the warm up day may not be able to be accommodated.

Please Note: There is no added charge for those wishing to stay over between The Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby & The Heart of the Continent. However, there will be no jumping allowed if stewards or medics are not present. Please indicate if you are planning on staying for The Heart of the Continent.

Bedding:

Ordered shavings will be delivered per stable/trainer and a shavings order list per competitor will be attached. Please be respectful and only take what you have ordered and don't take shavings from a different barn! If you forgot to order your shavings please ask the show committee. Ordered shavings will put on to your horse account.

Training and Warm up:

Warm ups for Hunters: 2-7pm Thursday and a half hour before the first class of each show day.

Jumpers schooling rounds on Friday 2-7pm.

Schooling is only permitted in designated areas and at designated times.

No jumping allowed without a medic on site. The medics will be at the showgrounds a half hour before warm ups on the warm up day and a half hour before the start of the classes on the show days.

The steward or show committee reserves the right to limit the number of horses in the warm up ring and holding areas.

Lunging is only permitted in the warm up ring or designated grass area on the North side of the stabling area. No lunging in the warm up ring when there are other competitors riding their horses. Competitors riding a horse will have the right to enter the warm up ring and the horses that are being lunged need to leave the warm up area immediately, no exemptions will be made.

Pig roast:

There will be a free pig roast at Saturday around 6:00 pm after the Amy Cummine special.

Competition numbers:

Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. See Article A814, Competition Number.

Show ring conduct:

1. No persons other than the officials or staff on duty may enter the competitive ring without the permission of the show manager or the show committee.
2. Saluting protocol: Please stay alert to the gate person's instructions on where to salute once in the ring.
3. The show committee may determine to preload or not preload at any time during the competition.
4. Competitors are only allowed in the show ring when competing or when the course is clearly marked 'OPEN'.
5. The show committee reserves the right to limit the number of horses in the warm up ring.
6. You must be on foot when leading a horse.

Completion of entry form:

Your Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby waiver must be signed, before riding any horse! If you are a minor, your parent or legal guardian must sign. Trainer signatures are not acceptable. Persons responsible must be over 18 and attending the show.

Your entry must include the following:

- Payment: please pay by Canadian cheque made payable to Marcy Schweizer Memorial Fund or etransfer to: 204-771-4010
- Horse name on entry must match the horse name listed on any official documents. No horse listed as 'Entry' will be accepted.
- Proof of your horse's Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months + 21 days, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds), as well as a negative Coggins test within the last 6 months. The name on the vaccinations/Coggins MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable.
- All competitors/owners/coaches/persons responsible must provide proof of their current EC memberships with their entry form. Riders will not be permitted to compete without proof of current memberships.

Memberships, horse recordings and vaccination paperwork:

A copy of the following needs to be sent to the show secretary: mhjaentries@gmail.com

- Equestrian Canada: sport license card (minimum Silver level)
- Manitoba Horse Council: membership card
- MHJA: membership number
- Horse recording number
- Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby waiver
- Vaccination (influenza and EHV 1&4) records within 6 months +/- 21-day grace period
- A negative Coggins test (valid within 12 months)

All the required paperwork must have been received by the show secretary before Saturday July 12th 2025.

Entries closing date:

Entries will close at midnight July 11th, 2025 unless stalls are sold out before the closing date.

Time schedules:

Tentative schedules will be available at the show office and will be posted true out the showgrounds. Please note that start times may change depending on weather and will be announced during the riders meeting.

Entry fees and starting:

1. You may add or withdraw from a class by the night before the start of the class. Classes after this time will not be refunded unless a vet note is provided.
2. Late adds may not be able to be accommodated. A \$25 late fee will be added for the classes added after the cut off time.
3. Hors concours entries are permitted in the jumper ring only, but the horse will be not allowed to return in the ring at the same day.

Prizes:

All prize money will be applied to the horse's account. Any credits after the show will be printed on a cheque. The cheque will only be issued to the rider/owner as indicated on the entry form and will be paid out when the account is closed. Unless otherwise indicated on the entry form, all prize monies are awarded to the owner.

Close out:

You must pay your show bill ("close out") with either cheque, cash or etransfer. Accounts not closed within the same day of the end of the show will be subject to a \$50 outstanding accounts fee.

All financial matters will be closed one week after the end of the show.

Protests:

Official protest shall be made in writing and delivered to the show secretary accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.

Show committee decisions:

It is important to understand that interpretations of existing rules and regulations and the invoking of additional rules and regulations to cover unforeseen circumstances are the sole responsibility and authority of the show committee. All owners, trainers, competitors and grooms agree to the acceptance of interpretations and additional rulings by virtue of your signed entry.

It is the objective of the show committee to run the show on the highest possible level of sportsmanship. Judges, course designers, and officials have been selected based on their knowledge and experience and their decisions in the competitions are their own responsibility. The show committee accepts no responsibility for their decisions.

Excusing or disqualifying:

Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials or staff shall, at the determination of the show committee, result in disqualification. Such unacceptable behaviour will result in forfeiture of show fees paid and prize money, and acceptance in future shows will be determined by the show committee.

The show committee reserves the right to remove any groom, trainer, rider, parent, manager or owner or all of a related group from the show without being liable for compensation.

Inhumane treatment of any horse on the grounds is forbidden; if a violation occurs the show committee has the right to disqualify the competitor from the show. Such unacceptable treatment will result in forfeiture of show fees paid and prize money, and acceptance in future show will be determined by the show committee. Refer to Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse, F.E.I. Nov. 1990.

In the case of a disqualification of a horse or horses, the winner of the next succeeding prize shall take the prize that had been awarded to the disqualified horse(s) and the other prizes will be adjusted accordingly.

Liability:

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Neither the Red River Exhibition nor the show committee, nor any of its staff or agents shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen, from any cause or circumstances whatsoever, to exhibitors, competitors or members of their family or their agents or to any one on the show grounds or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on the show grounds or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the show or any journey to or from the show.

It is to be understood and agreed that under no circumstances shall the show committee, its owners, agents, employees, or family be liable for any loss, damages, claims or costs occasioned or suffered by any exhibitor, competitor, members of their family, or their agents, directly or indirectly, howsoever arising, including without limitation, losses, damages, claims or costs as a result of the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby, its owners, agents or employees negligence, and you agree to indemnify and save harmless the Marcy Schweizer Memorial Derby, its owners, agents and employees from and against any and all liability arising out of any such loss, damages, claims or costs.

Hunter Specials

All Specials will be judged on performance, manners and way of going. Horses will be shown over one round and will be judged on an open numerical point system.

Each horse/pony may only enter in one hunter special class during this competition. An exception of this rule is the Hermann's cheater special. Each horse/pony competing in the cheater special may enter into one other hunter special.

To be eligible for a hunter special, each horse/pony must have shown in at least one hunter division at this competition. Each horse/pony must compete at the highest height they have shown at unless there is no hunter special at that height, in which case they may enter a hunter special at a lower height.

\$200 2'0/2'3"/2'6" Pony Special: \$35 entry fee
